1/2 cup butter or margarine
2 ounces (2 squares un-sweetened chocolate
1 teaspoon vanilla
Pipe cleaners
Thick confectioners sugar frosting

Heat puffed rice in shallow pan in moderate oven (350 degrees) 10. minutes
Four into large greased bowl. Melt marshmallows, butter and chocolate over low heat (may use double boiler) Stir until smooth
Add vanilla; blend thoroughly. Pour over puffed rice; stir until evenly coated.

With greased hands, shape candy into 6 large balls for "bodies" and 6 small balls for "heads". Use pieces of pipe cleaners for "ears", "whiskers" and "tails". Apply frosting with cake decorator to form "eyes" and the "mouths". Attach "heads" to "bodies" with frosting
Makes 6 large cats

HOT DOG AND CHEESE TOASTIES

(2 cups spread)
1/2 pound sharp Cheddar cheese
1/2 pound hot dogs, cooked
1/2 cup catsup
1 egg
1 tablespoon picnic relish

2 teaspoons prepared mustard
Put cheese and hot dogs through a food grinder, using a medium course blade
Mix with catsup and cook over very low heat until the cheese melts. Add the beaten egg and cook 2 minutes more
Remove from heat, add relish and mustard.
Spread on buttered toasted buns and serve at once or spread on buns and broil for 2 - 3 minutes. Top with a little more grated cheese.

SNICKER SNACKS

2 cups puffed rice
2 cups puffed wheat
2 cups mixed salted nuts
2 cups french fried potato sticks
4 ounces pretzel rings
1/2 cup butter or margarine melted
1 tablespoon Worcester-shire sauce
1/2 teaspoon onion salt
1/4 teaspoon garlic salt
Heat oven to 300 degrees.
Place puffed rice, puffed wheat, nuts, potato sticks and pretzels in large shallow baking pan

2-4D May Be Research Tool

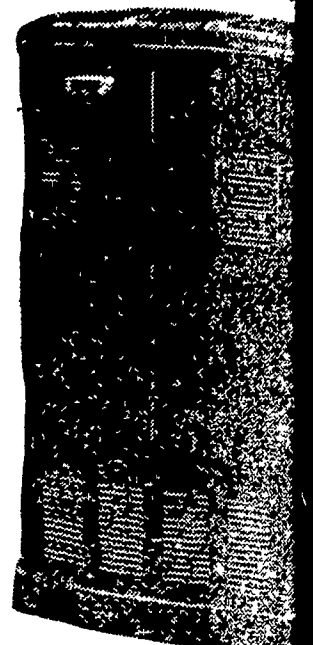
Agricultural chemists at the Michigan Agricultural Experiment Station report that they have treated plants with 2, 4-D and as a result changes occurred in mineral content in several portions of the treated plants
Chemist Sam Bass of the Michigan Station says changes were observed in the percentages of boron, calcium, iron, magnesium, potassium, phosphorus, and sodium in the various parts of the plant. But in the roots, he says, percentages of iron and manganese were about the same in treated and non-treated plants
Just why variations occur in amounts of minerals deposited in different parts of the plant treated with 2, 4-D is not known, but it is apparent Bass says, that some of the

plant mechanisms are altered. He feels that these studies may help speed up the investigations on plant life.

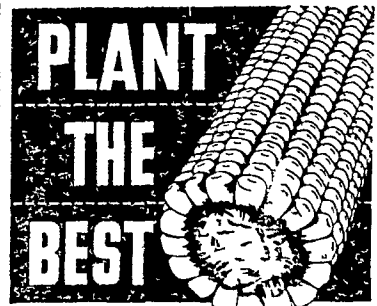

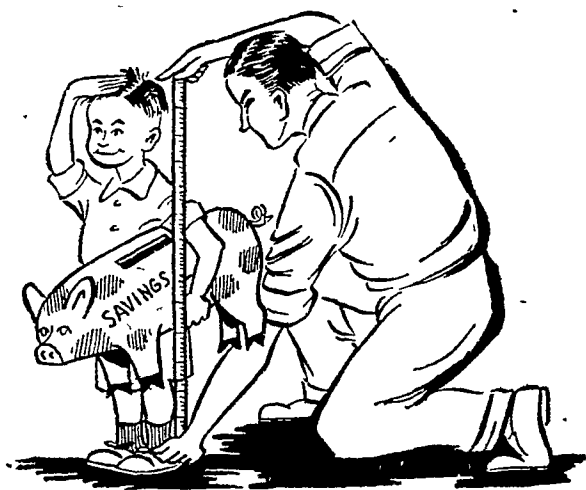
