

Broilers Continue To Slip

Broilers were about steady week at the Lancaster poultry center when 43 of 51 lots offered were sold. Prices ranged from 15.1 to 15.9 on the 30 lots of 102,725 broilers with 71% in the 15-15.9 range.

Four lots of 4,365 heavy broilers brought 14.4 to 15.1, lot of 2,500 Leghorn broilers brought 9.7, and one lot of Males sold at 8.5. Six lots of capettes totaling 5,725 head sold for prices ranging from 21 - 27 cents. The sale continues to run about the same as the corresponding sale offered last year when the average price of 17.02. Demand is Fair Offerings Good

Delmarva closed this week with 630,100 head going at prices of 14.0 to 16.0. Demand was only slow to fair with offerings ample, demands increased slightly in some instances. Estimated slaughter for the week end is 619,000 head.

The Delmarva broiler-fed ratio for the week ending Oct. 30 was down two points from last week to 3.5 with broilers at 15.78 and mash costing \$90.30 per ton. Corresponding week last year had a ratio of 3.5 when broilers were 16.63 and mash \$95.00 per ton.

Fluid Milk Bottling Demand Fair To Good

Fluid milk production was mostly unchanged at southern points, irregular in the Philadelphia area and lighter from New York through New England. Bottling demand was fair to good Offerings were fully ample in New York and Boston but only adequate in Philadelphia where supplies were not as freely available as last week. Price of bottling quality milk in New York was unchanged at \$5.90 per 40 quart unit.

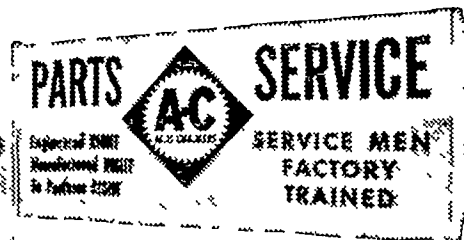

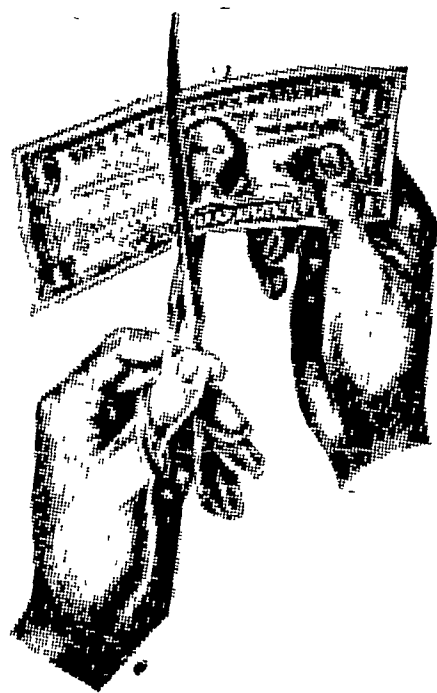
