

Farm Show Exhibit Space Is Limited, Director Explains

Farm Show Director John B. McCool reminded 4-H Club baby beef and lamb exhibitors today that December 12 is the deadline for entries in the 1960 Farm Show. The 44th annual Farm Show will be held January 11 to 15, 1960.

Open class exhibitors were required to have their entries in by November 16, but 4-H Club entry deadlines are delayed until county and regional roundups can be held, McCool explained. McCool added that heavy entries in the dairy, beef cattle, horse, swine and sheep departments are again causing housing problems this year. "We will have to cut some entries because we do not have room in the Farm

Show Buildings for all the animals entered," McCool said. Last year about 150 dairy cows were refused entry due to space limitations.

There will be 23 classes in the 4-H Club sheep show. These include eight pen classes, and a championship pen class. To be shown are Hampshire, Shropshire, Dorset, Southdown, Cheviot and Suffolk lambs.

Breeding sheep of these 6 breeds will also be exhibited by 4-H Club boys and girls. Fitting, showmanship, blocking and grooming contests will be held.

Nineteen classes will be open to 4-H Club baby beef showmen. These include light weight, medium weight, light-heavy weight and heavy weight divisions of three breed classes, Hereford, An-

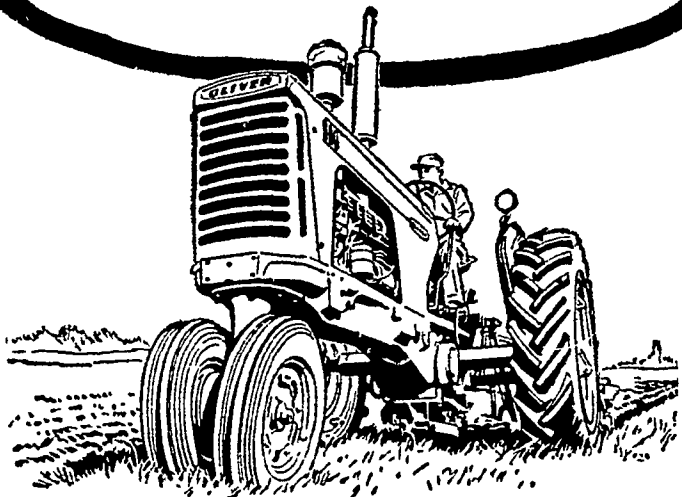
