**Dairymen Are Warned
Keep Drugs Out Of Milk**

Warnings by the Food and Drug Administration that there will be stricter enforcement of rules that prohibit the sale of milk containing antibiotics or pesticide residues must be taken very seriously by everyone in the dairy industry, and strict action should be taken to see that the regulations are not violated

This is the general opinion of dairy people gathered in a survey made by the American Dairy Association's public relations department

In light of the tremendous publicity accorded to the recent cranberry - situation, dairy industry leaders are very much concerned about the great damage which could be done to milk if Food and Drug Administration officials are forced to file lawsuits against dairies or producers in order to enforce the rules

The importance of milk in the American diet and its almost universal use in every home makes milk a primary subject of headlines whenever any adverse situation is discovered Announcements that lawsuits have been filed on the basis that there have been violations of the rules against the presence of antibiotics or pesticide residues in milk would probably start another flood of very unfavorably publicity for milk

It is important, the American Dairy Association feels, that every channel of communication to milk producers be used to emphasize the need for following very carefully the instructions for use of antibiotics and pesticides Present tests used by government inspectors can detect very minute portions of adulterants in milk, and it is extremely urgent that everyone in the dairy industry understand that there is, under the law, no tolerance allowed Even the very faintest trace of antibiotic or pesticides in milk is a violation of the health regulations

Manufacturers of antibiotics and pesticides are required by the government to prove that the instructions they provide in the labels will, if followed, guard against the presence of the

substances in food products However, carelessness or failure to follow the instructions has resulted in contamination of milk, and other foods, with these products which are most important and useful in modern farming practice if properly used

From the point of view of the dairy industry's public relations, the American Dairy Association is urging every milk producer, every dairy fieldman, every proces-

sing operation to undertake an immediate program to guard against any contamination of milk of any kind
