farming activities for James He has at present two sows 20 shoats and two acres of tobacco. Plans for this year call for continuation of these projects and the addition of an acre of corn and a patch of onions.

Before becoming reporter for the local FFA James had represented his chapter as a delegate to the national convention of the American Institute of Cooperation, had won the chapter title in judging at Lampeter Fair and placed second in the county judging at the same fair, and was a member of the parlimentary procedure team that placed third in the county His judging carried him to PSU to represent the local chapter in state competition.


