Delmarva reported prices for the 24 hour period ending at 10:30 Friday on 679-100 head ranging from 16.60 to 19.10.

Estimated slaughter for the week end was 520,000 head compared to 487,000 head last week end.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending January 8 was 37 with broilers averaging 16.95 and mash costing \$91.72 a ton. The ratio last week was up to 39 with broilers at 18.30 and mash at \$93.96.

Georgia reported prices of 17 to 18 at the farm for 1,454,000 head. Estimated slaughter for the week end is 1,648,000 head.

Philadelphia

Notes Increase

Production was reported steady to slightly higher. At Philadelphia increases were noted to be five to 15 percent above a year ago levels. Bottling demand mostly good to fair. Excess surplus noted particularly at Philadelphia and Boston, moved to separators.

Prices at New York for bottling quality milk ranged from \$5.40 to 5.50 per 40 quart unit.
