

Prices Dip Slightly

Prices slipped about an-half cent at the poultry market this week. Twenty-five lots of broilers sold at 18.1 to 20.1 for 73,000 birds. Only one lot of broilers sold at the lower end of the average. While the average price was down from the average of last week, it was all a cent per pound over the corresponding sale last week and brought the January average for broilers to 19.25 compared to the average for birds during January 1959.

January 28 sale also had 2,050 cockerets at 25.2 to 28.9 and four lots of 3,405 pullets going at 26.6. One lot of 2,500 fowl brought 12c.

Six lots of 94,470 birds were offered and a total of 81,120 birds in 28 lots were sold. Two lots of broilers and seven lots of roasters were withdrawn by the sellers for lack of sufficient orders. Results of the complete sale follows:
