CHECK BEFORE REFINISHING

Many Honors For Young Chapter

The Warwick FFA chapter was started in the fall of 1956. The beginning membership was 14 boys the first year and has grown to a membership of 34 boys this year. The chapter has been quite active in the years it has been operative.

The main farming programs of the boys are centered around hogs, dairy, corn and tobacco. This past year the boys' labor income from supervised farming

programs amounted to \$18,916.36. Each boy in the chapter has a minimum of two enterprises and most have four or more productive projects as well as various improvement projects.

The Warwick chapter as a group maintains a 35 acre plot of ground near the school on which various demonstrations are conducted and new practices are tried.

Two years after the chapter was formed, two boys were awarded the Keystone

Farmer degree. Vincent Becker and Donald Longenecker both were awarded the degree as Juniors. This past year Kenneth Binkley and Clyde Forney were also awarded the Keystone degree in their Junior year.

The Warwick Chapter has won the Sears Foundation Swine award for the past two years. In 1958 Kenneth Seibert won the award and in 1959 Clyde Forney was selected. This past year the chapter also won the Lancaster County Judging contest at the Lampeter Fair and James Brubaker was awarded the Ayrshire calf presented by the breed association at the same fair.

The chapter has had many accomplishments in the past and looks forward to many more in the future.

1960 EARLY BIRD REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

ECONOMY OF PROGRAM

Basis present feed costs you can grow Leghorn pullets to 20 weeks of age on a feed cost of 75 cents or LESS.

On the EARLY BIRD PROGRAM it takes about 19 pounds of feed or less to grow a Leghorn pullet to 20 weeks.

1. The Early Bird feed required on growing the 1958 Random Sample pullets for the Pennsylvania Egg Laying Contest was 19.1 pounds.
2. On the 1959 State contest pullets, feed required was 19.0 pounds.
3. On the Claude Hess Farm, R. D. #2, Ephrata; 5,000 pullets were grown in 1959, on 18.9 pounds of feed.
4. Mr. Walter Ames of Narvon, Penna., raised 2,000 exceptionally fine pullets to 20 weeks of age on 17.32 pounds of feed.

ESTIMATE OF FEED REQUIRED

This 19 pounds of feed consists of approximately the following quantities.

At present costs for feed in ton lots, this gives a feed cost per pullet of 75 cents using bagged feed.

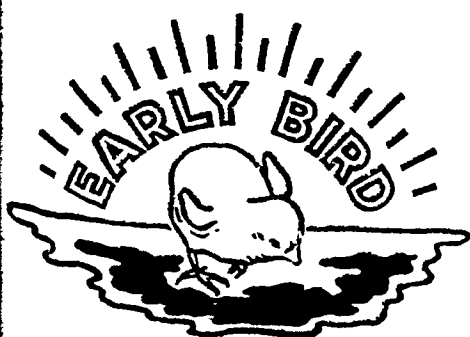
