

We hear a great deal about restricted feeding programs. All growing pullets, including light medium, and heavy strains, must be restricted

The question is how much restriction is net essary and how can it best be accomplished We have by experience a ready answer.

Because oats are one-third fiber, which is not digestible by poultry, increasing the amount of oats in the ration reduced the rate of growth deposition of fat
