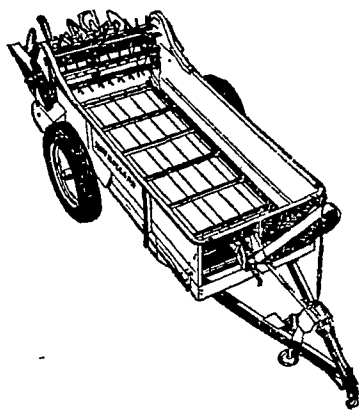

## Insecticide In Fertilizer Is Problem

Timing the application is the big problem in using insecticides in fertilizer, according to Lloyd E. Adams, Extension Entomologist at the Pennsylvania State University. Adams spoke during the annual Lime and Fertilizer Conference recently at Penn State.

Insecticide timing must coincide with fertilizer application where the two are combined, Adams said. The conference took place as thousands of farmers in the State made annual plans for fertilizer use this spring and summer.

He said that most insecticide-fertilizer mixes used in Pennsylvania are designed for individual farmers — "a" (Turn to page 12)
