

State Man Appointed

On Board of Hall Of Fame

Lyman E. Jackson, Dean of the College of Agriculture at the Pennsylvania State University, is among the incorporations for the Agricultural Hall of Fame now under construction near Kansas City, Kansas.

The Agricultural Hall of Fame will show the advance of civilization as measured by the progress of agriculture. Honoring the American farmer and his colleagues, the Hall of Fame will cover 409 acres near Kansas City.

Financed by private contributions, the project will cost around \$5,000,000. A fund raising campaign is now underway.

The project will center around a main building in which famous men and women of agriculture will be

honored. The Agricultural Hall of Fame will also feature a museum of farming, a library, an outdoor amphitheatre, field demonstration areas, and an international shrine. U. S. rural life in early days will be shown. An Indian village will depict original American farming.

Typical American farms will be displayed in miniature with moving grazing animals, tractors, and threshing machines. Displays will show the progress of products from farm to table, featuring trends, production and investment.

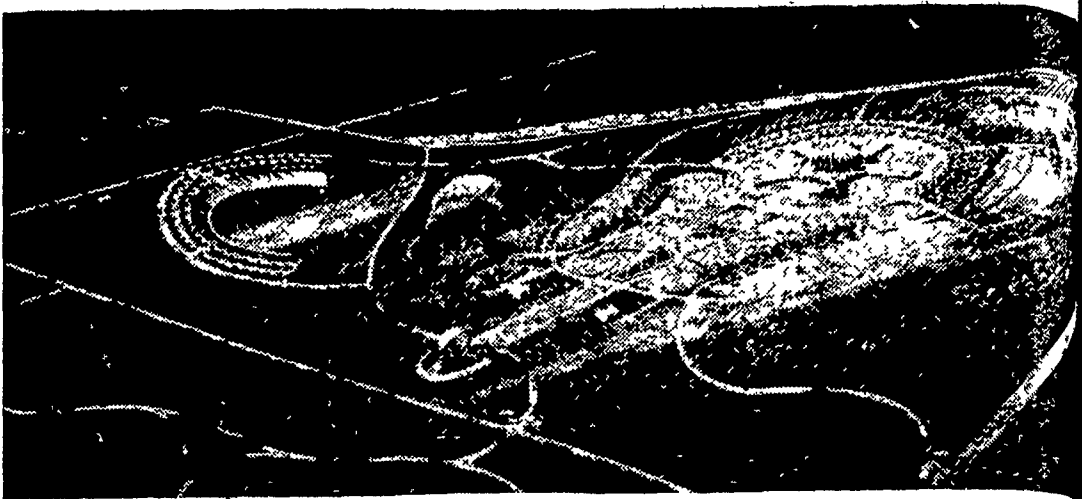

THIS ARTIST'S VIEW OF THE PLANNED Agricultural Hall of Fame and Exposition buildings shows the main shrine building in the center. The main building stand about 100 feet tall and contain some 80,000 square feet of floor space. The wings will be pointed toward the four main compass points and will be dedicated to agriculture in all sections of the United States. Some grading has been done at the site with actual construction scheduled to get underway in mid 1960.

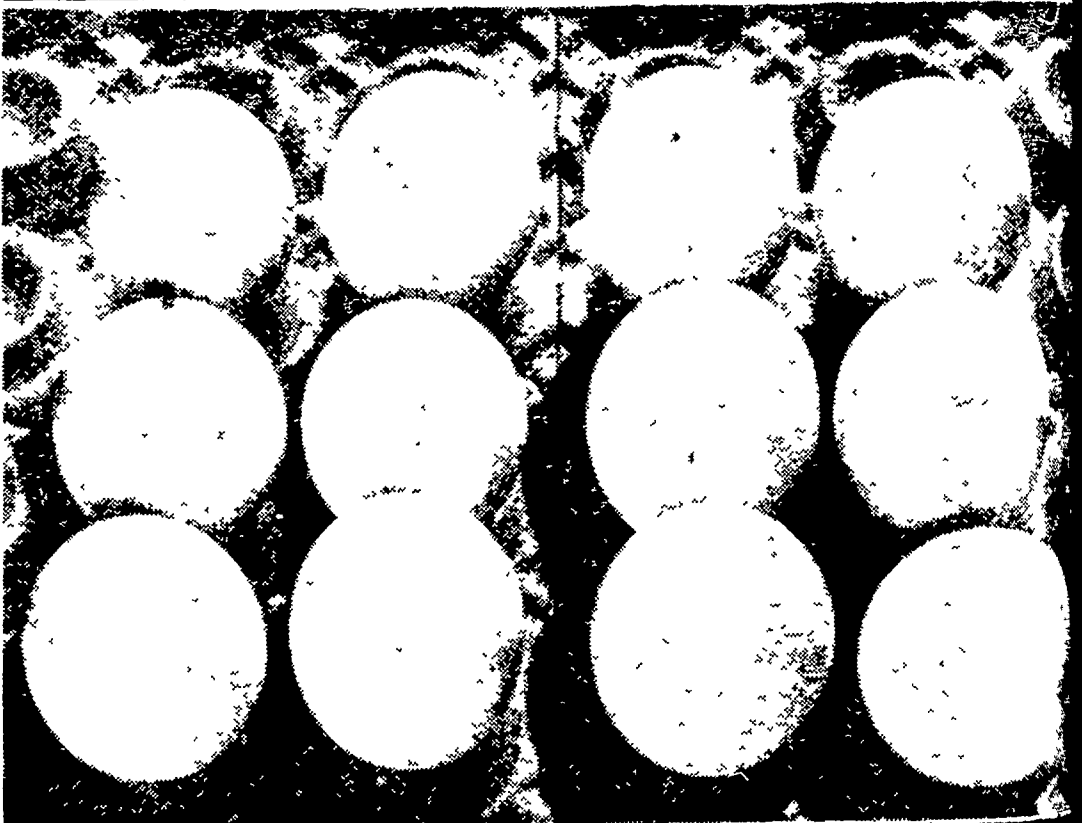
