Inspection of the Pennsylvania State University Campus and farms will be the agenda for the Lancaster County Guernsey Breeders' annual tour, the committee announced this week.

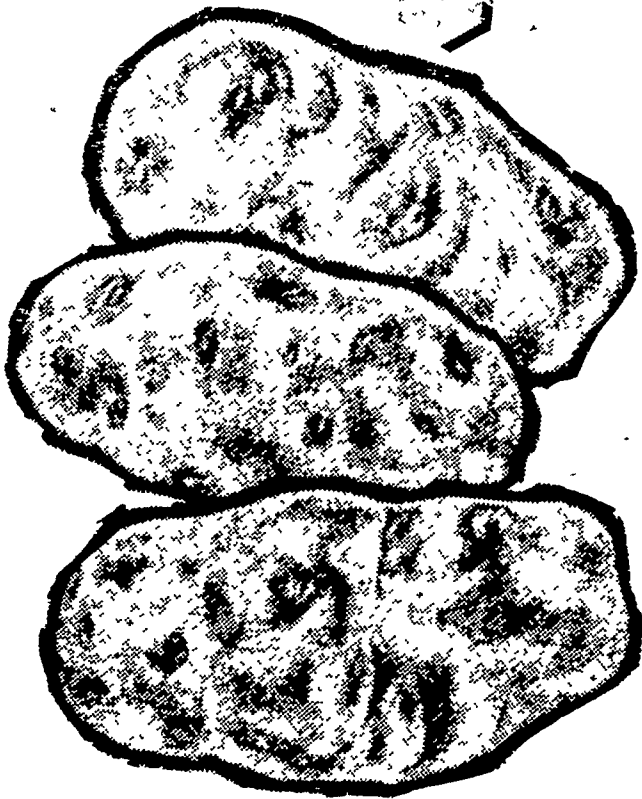
