# Delmarva - Georgia

## Prices Slip Supplies Good

Delmarva reported prices of 16.70 to 18.80 for 804,700 head at farms during the 24-hour period ending 10.30 a. m. Friday.

Prices averaged slightly lower with live supplies fully adequate for demand.

Estimated slaughter in Delmarva for the week end was 555,000 compared to the 624,000 head last week end.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending on March 25 regained the point it had lost the previous week. Broilers made 18.02 and mash cost \$91.22 per ton for a ratio of 4.0.

Georgia reported prices of 17 to 18.5 for 1,303,900 head at farms. Estimated slaughter by Georgia processors was 1,491,000 for the week-end.

## Fluid Milk Production Still On The Increase

Production of fluid milk continued to increase in all areas. Offerings were in excess of trading needs except at Atlanta where supplies were in balance with demand. Demand at Philadelphia showed some improvement, but was only fair at
