Boilers Gain Some Strength

Boilers gained some strength at the Lancaster Poultry Center this week. A total of 59,360 head sold at prices ranging from 18¢ to 23.6¢. Lots of 4,850 roasters brought 23.6¢, while one lot of 1,500 broilers brought 13.3¢. A lot of 50 pullets made up one lot of 20 van and one lot of 170 females brought 17.0¢. A May 5 sale offered a total of 76,970 head in 40 lots, with 32 lots containing 780 birds. Delmarva - Georgia

Prices Increase Fully 2 Cents

Delmarva reported prices ranging from 18 to 20¢ for 807,800 head at farms during the 24 hour period ending 10:30 Friday morning. This price was an average of two cents higher. The report included 558,700 head purchased at the Eastern Shore Poultry exchange at prices ranging from 19.50 to 20.4.

Estimated slaughter in Delmarva for the week end was 699,000 head compared to the 745,000 head last week end.

Demand for live poultry was strong and the movement of poultry was generally good although the early weekend buying was irregular.

Georgia reported sales of 959,000 head at prices ranging from 16.5 to 18.25 at farms for the 24 hour period ending 10:30 Friday morning. Estimated slaughter in Georgia for the week end was 1,761,000 head.

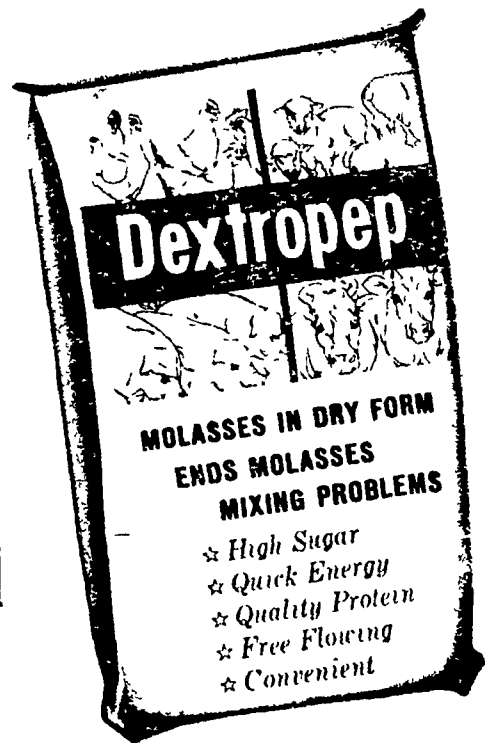
