Prices Slip Fractionally

Broiler prices slipped a fraction of a cent at the poultry center this week when 97,500 head in 21 lots brought prices of 18.6 to 20.1.

Six lots of cockerel roasters made 26.7 to 28.1 while pullet roasters brought 21.3 to 27.3 for 3,500 head in five lots. Two lots of Leghorns totaling 1,300 head made 14 to 14.5.

The sale offered a total of 125,060 birds in 44 lots and sold 109,200 head in 44 lots. Following is the complete May 12 sale with seller, grower in parentheses, amount and breed, age in weeks and days, buyer and price.

Delmarva - Georgia Prices Mostly Undetermined

Delmarva reported sales of 26,000 head on Thursday trading with 44 per cent at undetermined prices and 56 per cent intra company transfers. No sale was held at the Eastern Shore Poultry Growers exchange on Wednesday.

The Delmarva broiler-fed ratio for the week ending May 6 was up two points from the previous week at 3.8. Broilers averaged 17.64 and mash cost \$93.50 per ton.

Fluid Milk Southern Prodn. Over The Peak

Production of fluid milk is reported to be over the peak in southern areas and was mostly steady to slightly lighter than last week. In the middle Atlantic area, production tended higher with southwestern Pennsylvania reporting a record rate while the North East was steady and yet to move toward the seasonal high.

Bottling demand fair to good as surplus moved to separators and to manufacturing.

Wholesale prices at New York were unchanged at \$4.55 to 4.60 for 40 qt. unit.

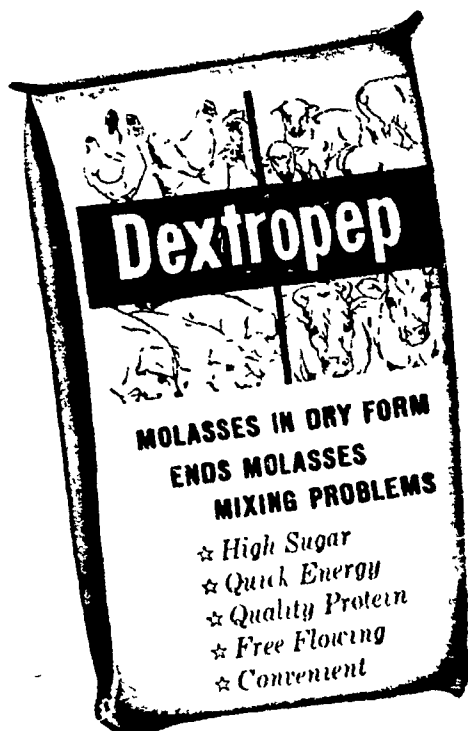
