sugar and 2½ tablespoons of hot water. Add 3 egg yolks, one at a time, beating well. Add ¼ cup margarine, a tablespoonful at a time. Blend. Spread on top and sides of cake.

For a dessert that will win praise from the severest critic, serve Fruitcake Summer Style.

FRUITCAKE SUMMER STYLE

Fruit Mixture:
1 seedless orange
1 cup seedless raisins
1 cup seeded raisins
½ cup coarsely chopped pecans
Grind the whole orange, mix the two kinds of raisins and pecans. Set aside

Batter:
½ cup butter
1 cup brown sugar, firmly packed
1 egg

¾ of the fruit mixture
1 teaspoon baking soda
2 cups sifted flour
½ teaspoon baking powder
1 cup buttermilk
1 teaspoon vanilla

Cream butter and sugar together until smooth and fluffy. Add egg, mixing in well. Add ¾ of the FRUIT MIXTURE. Sift together the flour, baking soda, baking powder and add alternately with buttermilk, to which vanilla has been added, mixing well after each addition. Bake in a greased 9-inch

square cake pan in a 350 degree oven for 45 minutes. Allow to cool in pan on cake rack. Frost with FRUIT FROSTING.

FRUIT FROSTING

¼ cup butter, softened
2 cups confectioners sugar
2 tablespoons cream
½ of fruit mixture
Cream together butter and confectioners sugar. Add cream and remaining ½ of FRUIT MIXTURE; mix well.

The next meeting is scheduled to be held on June in the Marietta Community Building when members Society number 12 will be guests.

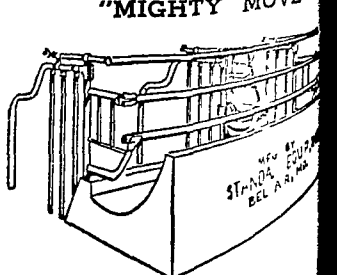
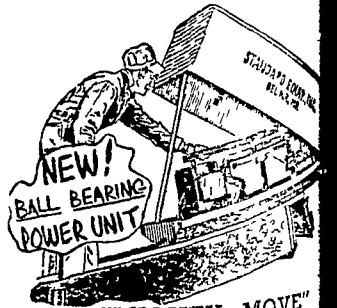
Little Britain 4-H Sewing Club Elects Officers
