CATTLE: 4000 compared with 4294 last week. Supply includes 55 percent slaughter steers and 35 percent stockers and feeders. Trading was slow. Compared with last week's close slaughter steers generally 50 lower. Cows 25-75 lower with most decline on average Cutter and better grades. Bulls and stockers & feeders steady.

Bulk of the Choice grade slaughter steers 950-1300 lbs. brought 27.00-29.00, few lots high-choice 1050-1200 lb. 29.50-30.25, load Prime 1252 lbs. sold at 31.25. Good to low-choice 24.00-27.00. Cutter, Utility and Commercial cows 16.75-19.75, early up to 20.50, Cannerns and low Cutters 15.25-16.75. Utility and Commercial bulls 20.00-23.50. Good grade bulls 23.00-25.00. Medium and Good 600-900 feeder steers 23.50-28.00, lot high-choice and Fancy 521 lb. stock calves 33.50.

CALVES: 650 compared with 552 last week. Trading moderately active. Vealers weighing over 140 lbs. were 2.00 lower, and weights under 140 lbs steady. Good & Choice vealers 29.00-34.00, Choice and Prime 34.00-37.00, a few on Monday sold up to 50.00. Standard and low-Good 27.00-29.00, Utility to 18.00.

HOGS: 1900 compared with 1921 last week. Trading active. Barrows and gilts were fully steady. Sows steady U. S. 1-2 grade 190-220 lb barrows and gilts sold for 18.00-18.50 with several lots the same weight no.

Chicago Cattle Large Supply Depresses Price

Cattle: Receipts here ten per cent lower than last week and slightly below last year. Consist of the supply altered with between 75 and 80 per cent steers. Vealers and stockers and feeders scarce. Percentage of prime in the slaughter steer supply continued about like the 3 5 of last week.

Large receipts and lower carcass beef prices made for sharply lower-trend Monday, but the bulk of the decline was erased Tuesday and Wednesday. Loadlots prime and mixed prime and choice steers steady to 50 lower, other slaughter steers steady. Vealers steady, stockers and feeders steady to 50 lower.

Load high prime 1375 lb. steers 33.50 equal to the highest here since last May. Loadlots prime and mixed choice and prime steers 1050 to 1350 lbs 29-31.50. Bulk of

the average choice steers 26-28.00 with closing sales 26-50-28.00. Loadlots mixed good and choice steers 25.50-26.25.

Good and choice vealers 27-32.00, standard 20.00-27. Load good to mostly choice 552 lb. stock steers 28.00. Load good and choice 535 lbs 26.50. Few medium and good 23.00-25.00.

Good and mixed good and choice 800 to 1010 lb. feeding steers 23.25-25.00.

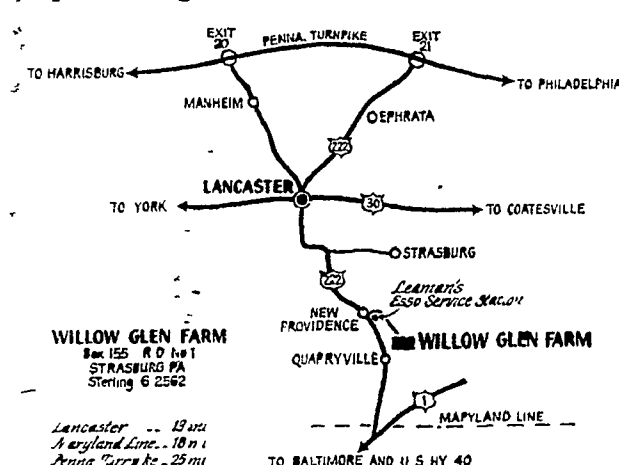

New Holland Steers Steady - 50 Higher

Compared with last week, slaughter steers closed steady to 50 higher at New Holland this week. Average cutter and better grades of cows 25 to 50 lower. Cannerns and low cutters steady. Bulls steady.

Receipts at the May 26 sale were 1146 cattle and 201 calves.

The bulk of the choice grade slaughter steers made 27 to 29.00. A few lots of 1057 to 1225 lb. weights - 29.10 to 30. Good to low choice were 24 to 27.50, standard - 21.50-24.

Good and choice heifers, 766 to 938 lbs. were 23.75 to 26.10. Standard were down to 19.

Cutter and utility cows made 16.50 to 19.50 with cannerns and low cutters - 15.50 to 17. Utility and commercial bulls were 20.50 to 23.50.

A lot of good grade 569 lb. stock steers sold at 27.00. Several lots of good grade 742-919 lb. feeder steers ranged from 24.35 to 25.50.

Vealers were 1.00 lower. Good and choice vealers made 28 to 36. Several lots of high choice made 36 to 37. Standard and low good vealers went at 25 to 29 with utility down to 22.25.

The May 25 dairy cattle sale had receipts of 147 cows nine stock bulls and 29 stock

heifers. The Dairy cow market was active and stronger. Feature of the sale was 30 head of Holstein springers due to freshen in two to three months. They sold from \$340 to \$450.

Fresh cows, Holstein - \$340-450, Guernsey - \$225-275, others - \$225-300. Stock bulls - \$85-170, stock heifers - \$65-180.

The May 23 horse sale had receipts of 288 head. The market was about steady on all kinds.

Mules, sing'les - \$120-175, pairs - \$240-350. Gelding ponies - \$70-130. Riding horses - \$120-250. Driving horses - \$120-260. Killers - 10c.

MEN'S SUIT COLLARS

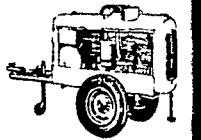
The collar of a man's suit is a key to its quality, says Mrs. Mae B. Barton, Pennsylvania State extension clothing specialist. The collar should fit the neck smoothly and snugly and allow 1/4 to 1/2 inch of the shirt collar to show at the back of the neck. To test the interlining bend a corner of the collar. If it's interlined with linen hand-shaped, the collar will flip back quickly. A collar interlined with sized cotton won't hold its shape so well.

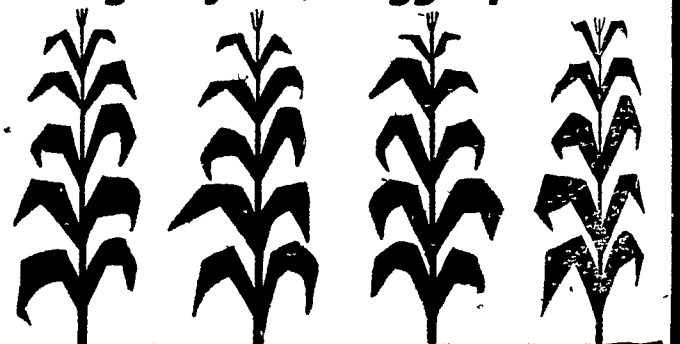
