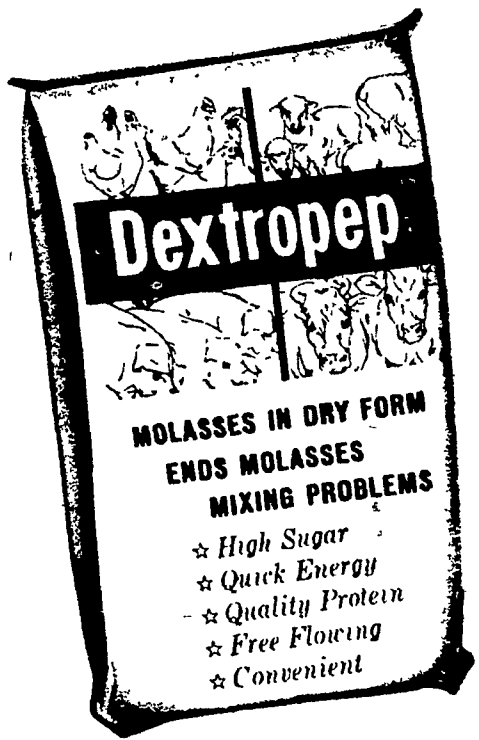

Delmarva - Georgia Est. Slaughter Down Slightly

Delmarva reported prices of 17.50 to 18.90 for 791,600 head sold during the 24 hr. period ending 10.30 Friday morning.

Estimated slaughter by Delmarva processors for the week end is 616,000 head compared to the 626,000 head last week end.

The Delmarva broiler-fe- ed ratio for the week end- ing May 20 was steady with the previous week at 4 0 Broilers averaged 18 27 and mash cost \$91 96 per ton.

Fluid Milk Production Peak Moves North

Milk production was low- er at Philadelphia and At- lanta, but increased at New York and Boston. Seasonal peaks were believed reached in southern New Jersey and New York.

Demand was lighter throu- ghout most of the Eastern seaboard. Surplus offerings heavy in all areas except Atlanta, moved mostly to separators and driers though some movement to cheese production.
