Vegetable growers made limited progress in their attempt to get plantings back on schedule. Delays caused by excessive rains are approaching the serious stage of the longer season crops

such as tomatoes and sweet corn.

Hay making swung into high gear this week as farmers waited for soil to dry out enough to plow for corn. Much of the legume acreage is showing some damage from weevil and the rush has begun to get the crop harvested before any extensive damage occurs.

Many Lancaster County tobacco fields are ready for planting. Some disease damage has been noted due to prolonged dampness and there has been yellowing from lack of sunshine.

Barley and wheat are leading in the county. Wheat is heading on most county farms. Considerable corn ground has not as yet been plowed and corn planting is now two to three weeks behind schedule. Yellowing of small grains in low wet fields are now at a point where there will be no grain production

Chapter president, Dolores Warfel, was mistress of ceremonies.

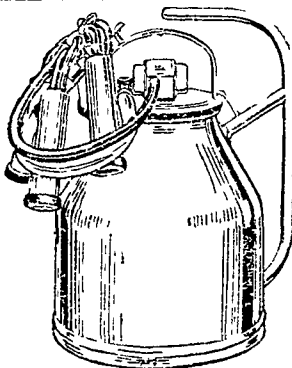
