Volume, Prices Slip

Broilers slipped slightly a this week at the Lancaster poultry center when prices paid ranged from 18 3/4 to 21 3/4 for 77,320 birds in 17 lots

Leghorn fowl continued to slip as two lots of 3,000 birds sold for 16.1. One lot of 300 heavy fowl brought 17.5 while 30 males sold for 18.5

Eight lots of 5,600 cockerel roasters made 23.7 to 26.7. Four lots of 3,900 pullets sold 22.7 to 25.2. The total June 2 sale had 91,575 head in 10 lots, and sold 90,150 head in 12 lots

The corresponding sale a year ago had 158,050 birds sold at prices ranging from 16.9 to 18.0. Following is the complete sale with seller, grower in parentheses, amount, breed, age in weeks and buyer and price.

Delmarva-Georgia Broiler Prices Slip Slightly

Live poultry prices averaged fractionally lower at Delmarva during the 24 hour period ending 10:30 Friday morning.

Prices at farms of 16 20 to 17 90 for 932,500 head. Delmarva processors estimated slaughter for the weekend at 764,000 head compared to the 616,000 head last weekend.

Offerings at Delmarva were relatively high, but the demand was fair to good and supplies were clearing well.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending on May 27 was steady with the previous weeks at 4.0 Broilers averaged 18 32 and feed cost \$92.24 per ton.

Fluid Milk Seasonal High Reported Near

Fluid milk production was reported at or near seasonal highs at New York and New England, but trended lighter at Philadelphia and Atlanta.

Both demand ranged from only fair to good. The Atlanta area had a light surplus moving to cheese production but all other areas reported heavy surplus moving to cheese production, separators and driers.
