Hostesses for the anniversary meeting were Mrs. Amos Shaubach, Mrs. Homsher,

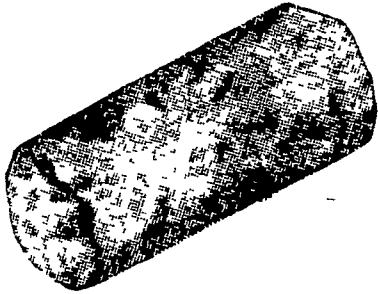
Mrs. Jesse Groff and Miss Groff and Mrs. Clarence Annie Sides. Approximately 45 members were present.
