

Broilers Gain Slightly

Broilers gained some length this week at the Poultry Center. One lot of 2000 broilers was withdrawn on a total of five lots of roasters using 4,690 head not sold at the bids. Six lots of cock-ers were sold at 23¢ to 26¢ for the 5,625 head. Pullet roasters in lots made 25 cents. Three lots of heavy fowl including 2,875 head sold at 15¢ to 18¢. One lot of 700 horn fowl made 15¢. The June 9 sale offered 5,765 head in 48 lots and 119,065 head in 41 lots. Delmarva - Georgia Prices Gain Then Slack

Delmarva reported prices of 17 to 19 at farms during the 24 hour period ending 10 30 Friday morning. Prices on an upward swing earlier in the week lost some of their gain in the late trading. The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending June 3 was down two points from the previous week at 3 8. Broilers averaged 17 74 and mash cost \$92 52 per ton. Georgia reported prices ranging from 17 to 19 on 845,000 head for the 24 hour period ending 10 30 Friday morning. Estimated slaughter by Georgia processors for the week end is 1,846,000 head compared to the 2,123,000 last weekend.

Fluid Milk Production Off At Most Points

Production of fluid milk was reported on the decline in all areas except New Eng-land where production con-tinued near peak seasonal levels. Bottling demand was lighter reflecting school closing. Surplus moved mostly to separators though cheese production and iced milk mix absorbed some excess offerings. Wholesale prices at New York tended higher with the price of bot-tling quality milk ranging from \$4.55 to \$4.60 per 40 quart unit.

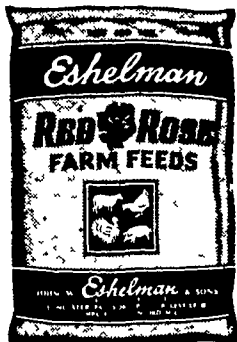

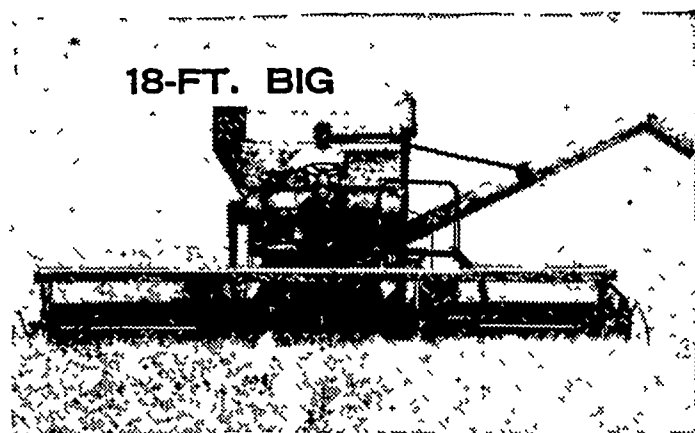
