

Poultry Center Broilers About Steady

Both the top and bottom prices paid for broilers was higher than the corresponding sales last week at the Poultry Center, Lancaster. The average price in the area was about steady. The June 16 sale, 14 of 59,800 broilers sold for prices ranging from 18.2¢ to 60¢ with 60 per cent of sales at 18.5¢ or under and only six percent at the figure.

A total of 4,975 pullets in eight lots made up to 25 while 4,400 cockers in seven lots made up to 26.1.

Four lots of 6,900 leghorn made 14.4 to 15.9; one of 980 heavy fowl made 19.7, and 80 males made 11.0.

Delmarva - Georgia Ample Offerings Depress Price

Prices of 17.30 to 18.20 for 593,000 head of broilers was reported by Delmarva for the 24 hour period ending 10.30 Friday morning. Estimated slaughter by eastern shore processors for the weekend was 620,000 head compared to the 630,000 head last week end. Live prices averaged slightly lower with offerings ample but not burdensome. The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending on June 10 climbed one point from the previous week to 3.9 with broilers selling at an average of 18.25 and mash costing \$92.52 per ton.

Fluid Milk Over The Peak At All Points

Fluid milk production for the week was reported lower at all areas but at points was above levels of last year. The demand was less active as rainy weather and closing of schools made utilization lighter. Surplus generally moved to separators for fluid cream needs. Wholesale prices at New York for bottling quality milk was \$4.60 to 4.65 per 40 quart unit.

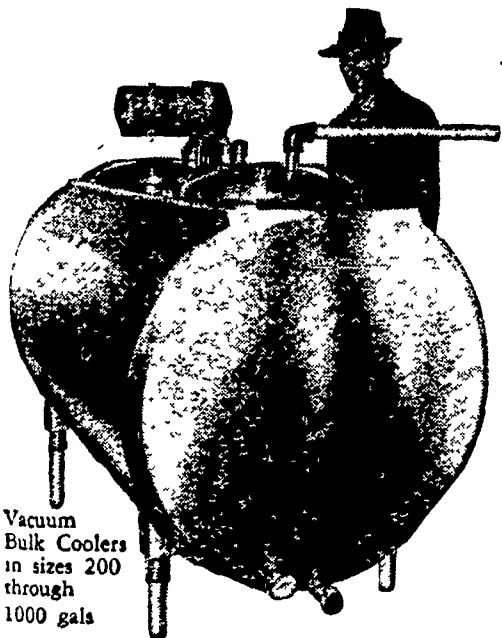

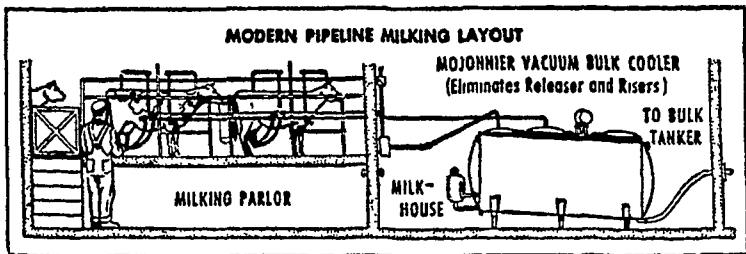

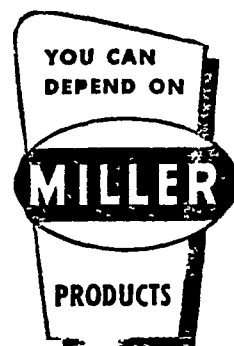
