

Best Food Buys

Outdoor Cookery Items Featured

With summer officially here, even greater emphasis will be centered around the bar-b-que grille and out-door cookery as a refreshing change in the meal-time scene. The summertime food supply makes it possible to plan appealing picnic menus, reports Tom Piper, Penn St-

ate Marketing Agent. Beef continues in the spotlight at retail meat counters this week-end. Declining beef costs have sent wholesale prices to their lowest level of the year to date. Steaks will be featured in many food markets leading a variety of retail values. Chicken will be featured in many food markets at generally unchanged prices. Shoppers will have a choice of whole chicken, halves or parts; bargain prices will continue on small turkeys. Summertime brings an abundance of fresh vegetables to local markets. This heavy supply condition results in lower prices for most commodities and adds to the list of very good buys. Snap beans and small summer squash are bargain items this week. Other good

buys include cabbage, cucumbers, endive, escarole, radishes, peppers, spinach and other leafy greens. Prices have dropped sharply for eastern grown round type potatoes. A very late spring in many areas has resulted in an overlapping potato harvest and an unusually heavy build up of supplies. Home grown cherries will appear as a highlight on many fruit counters this week end. The peak of the sweet cherry harvest will come this week in Southcentral Pennsylvania. Banana prices have dropped at the wholesale level. Watermelons are much lower in price as supplies from Florida promise to deluge the market in the next week to ten days. Quality is excellent. Liberal supplies of cantaloupes are arriving from the western growing areas; prices are about as low as can be expected considering the shipping distance and cost of transportation.

State Agency Secures Most Migrant Labor

The Farm Placement Bureau of the Department of Labor and Industry represented the farmers of Pennsylvania in contracting for more than three-fourths of all the migrant workers from southern states needed to harvest crops in the state this year

Announcement was made to a meeting of the Governor's Committee on Migratory Farm Labor by Alvan Frank, State Farm Placement Supervisor, it was reported by Secretary of Labor and Industry William L. Batt, Jr., chairman of the Governor's Committee

Seventy-seven crews were lined up for Pennsylvania farmers by the Department's representatives in Florida last April as they toured the Florida State Employment Centers with representatives of the Farm Placement Bureau of other states

The crew leaders contracted to bring more than 3,100 southern workers into the State between June 15 and late October. This compares with sixty crews and 2,900 workers in 1959.

In addition to the crews contracted by the Farm Placement Bureau another twenty or twenty-five crews will be hired by Pennsylvania farmers without using the machinery set up by the State.

The remainder of the State's seasonal farm labor force, totalling about 50,000 will be drawn from the local Pennsylvania labor markets.

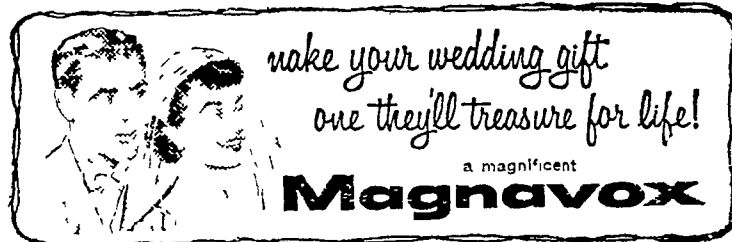

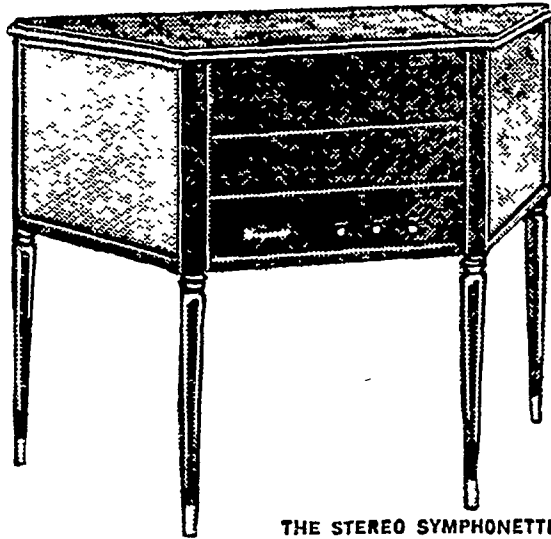

Our cattle farms are located on each side of Highway 206, 1 1/2 miles this side of Vincentown, N. J., or about 6 miles from N. J. Turnpike Exit no. 5. Look for eight silos, 4 silos on each side of highway, also telephone us the night before for an appointment to meet us.

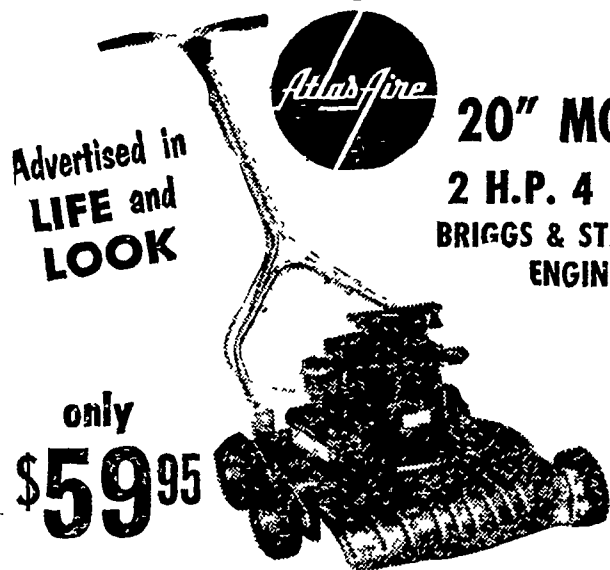

Nonfat Dry Milk

- 1/2 teaspoon salt
 - 1 cup sugar
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla
 - 3/4 cup instant nonfat dry milk
 - 3 cups cornflakes
 - 1 cup chopped walnuts
 - 1 1/2 cups (3 1/2 - ounce can) coconut

Place egg whites in large bowl; add cream of tartar and salt. Beat until soft peaks are formed slowly, continuing until very stiff, then add vanilla and beat in nonfat dry milk, a little at a time. Fold in cornflakes, walnuts and coconut. Drop by teaspoon onto cookie sheet. Bake 20-25 minutes in a 300 degree oven, or until lightly browned.
