ornia and worked through an interpreter In the 6 months we were here I did not have an opportunity to practice English. In the classwork at Cornell, I did not understand 70 or 80 per cent of the things the professor said, but now I can practice the language"

When asked what impressed him most about the coun-

try, Elgin said, "This is a free country, but I think it may be a little dangerous for the future of the country. The young people are so free, and maybe they do not appreciate the responsibility that goes along with freedom. Maybe I don't say what I mean too well because of my poor English, but maybe the very young and very free do not have enough guidance from the parents"

"There is very close co-

operation between our countries," he said, "And we like Americans very much. Unfortunately some of the American tourists have not always made a good impression, but we know they are the exception rather than the rule."

One of the things which impressed him most he said is the close cooperation between agencies and the way information is given out to

the farm people. Elgin will return to Turkey July 16.
