ing power level as 1940?
All that farmers ask is a
fair break on income from
the products of their labor
and investment, not govern-
ment hand-outs. Is that too
much to ask? At present
they are getting only about
50% of the national average
income.
This is not a partisan poli-
tical issue. It would be a
national tragedy if either
party attempts to make poli-
tical capital out of the mis-
takes of the past, or to ig-
nore its own short-comings
in the development of sound
farm legislation. We are con-
fident that the statesmen in
both parties recognize that
we need. We know that the Am-
erican people—both farmers
and non farmers—expect you
to do so.

PRODUCE MORE SILAGE
You can get more silage
from summer annuals, such
as corn, sorghum, sudan-
grass, and millets, than from
perennial legumes or grasses.
Research at the Pennsylva-
nia State University Agricul-
tural Experiment Station
produced 12.7 to 23.9 tons
per acre on a 70 percent
moisture basis.


