


## Farm Work Is Nearly On Schedule

Northern Pennsylvania farmers had only one good day for field work and southern tarmers two during the week ended June 20, reports the Crop Reporting Service in its weekly crop and weather roundup.

The ground was again too wet for cultivation or support of heavy farm equipment early in the week, the State Agriculture agency said.

However, harvest of sweet cherries started in the Blue Mountain area and picking is expected to start in Erie start next week in southern counties. Strawberry harvest has passed its peak locally and volume is now declining.

Some early cabbage and snap beans are being harvested in Lancaster and neighboring counties and harvest of Alaska variety of green peas was finished by the end of last week. Other green pea varieties should be harvested this week

Other crops are starting to show the results of prolonged below normal temperatures accompanied by excessive rainfall Staked tomatoes in the Washington Boro area show a poor set and the crop is about a week later than normal Sweet corn is also about a week behind normal development. Weed control is difficult in early fields, but many crops were cultivated this week. Some field corn is yellow, due largely to the weather Nights are still too cool for good corn growth, and it will take some fast growing to get some of it to the farmer's idea of "knee high by the Fourth of July"

Barley is ripening fast and combining started this week. Some barley crops have been cue with the binder and are in the shock


