Hay Driers To Tour County

Hershey, Pa., July 9.—The Northeastern Hay Drying Association, which last summer toured farms in the Hershey-Lebanon area, will hold its second tour in Pennsylvania in this section on Friday, August 26. Charles M. Wolgemuth, manager of Hershey Estate farms, and NHDA

president, and Howard Bornberger, Lebanon, R. D., will me the committee in charge.

The hay driers will visit the Masonic Homes farms, Elizabethtown, during the morning to see wagon drying in operation. In the afternoon they will witness forage machinery and equipment in operation on the Hershey Estate farms. Grass will be cut and hay baled, weather permitting. The tour will follow by a day the opening of the three-day extension Southeast District Hay Show in the Hershey stadium.

Exit no. 5, turn right towards Mount Holly, and stop at first gas station and telephone us and our fieldman will come and lead you over to our cattle farms. Our cattle farms are located on each side of Highway 206, 1 1/2 miles this side of Vincentown, N. J. or about 6 miles from N. J. Turnpike Exit no. 5. Look for eight silos, 4 silos on each side of highway, also telephone us the night before for an appointment to meet us.
