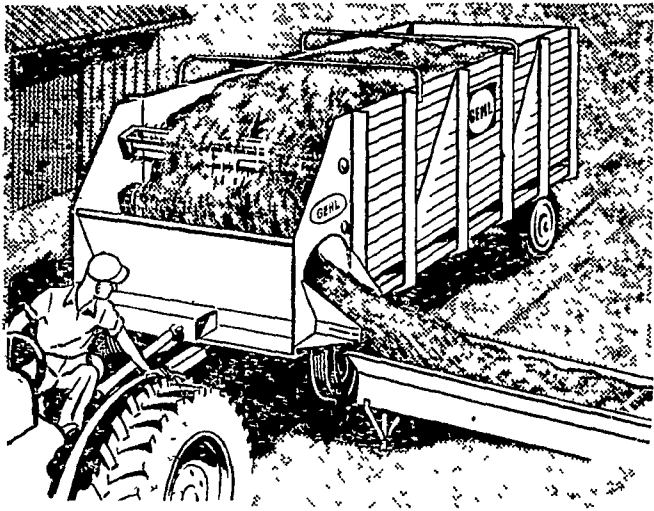

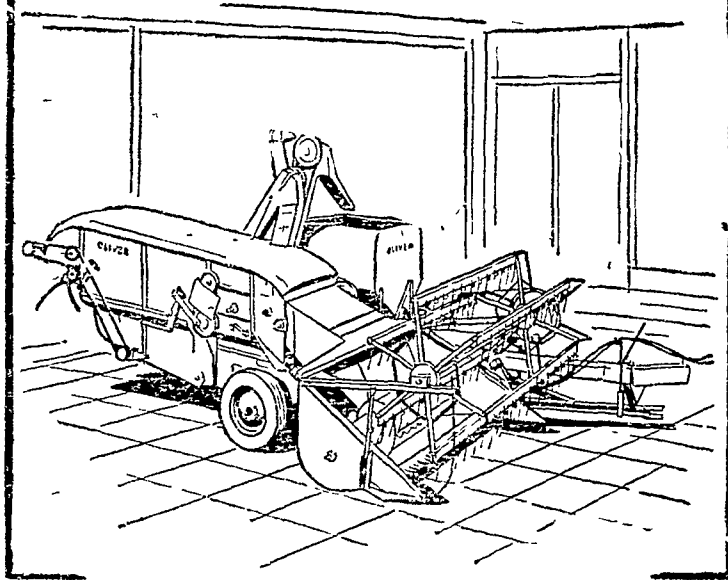

gthyise and crosswise. Hang across several lines so the blanket can air dry quickly. Some dryers may give instructions for machine drying.

**Q. How do you waterproof a raincoat?**

**A.** You can ask your dry cleaners to treat your coat or use a spray-on solution. Your dry cleaners can treat your raincoat with a waterproofing material. But if both the coat and the lining aren't made of a firm, closely woven material you may not have the best results. The spray-on solution may be handy for the things you wash at home. Notion counters and mail order houses usually carry it.

**Q. How do I keep nylon thread from spilling off the spool as I sew with it?**

**A.** For either Dacron or nylon thread use a felt pad under the spool. If your ma-

chine has one be sure it is in place, then these threads will stay on the spool. Or cut a circle out of a piece of felt and put a hole in the center so the felt can slip over the spool holder. It also helps to put the spool of thread on the machine with the notch in the spool to the top.

**Q. Can any material be permanently pleated at home?**

**A.** Nylon, Orlon, Dacron and such types of synthetics will take pleats that last quite well. They can be more successfully done commercially than at home, but with the right amount of heat, moisture and pressure it can be done. If you use a blend be sure that at least half the combination is a synthetic such as 55 percent Orlon - 45 percent wool. You'll have to touch up the pleats after several wearings since few pleats are really permanent.

**Q. Is there a homemade**

paste that youngsters can use for making scrapbooks?

**A.** You can make a floor paste easily that will stick well and store for some time. Mix together 1/2 cup sugar, 1/2 cup flour, 1/2 teaspoon powdered alum. Stir in two cups water and cook over a double boiler until thick. Stir often to keep from sticking. Remove from the heat and add 15 drops oil of cloves. Store in covered jar.

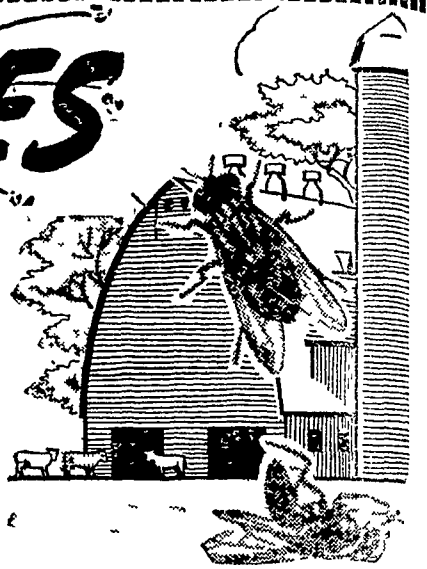
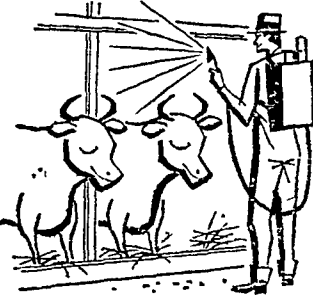
