

Eight 4-H Members Move To State Finals

Kutztown — Four two-member demonstration teams from Lancaster County captured first place awards in the district 4-H club demonstration contests here Tuesday and the right to compete in the State contests next month at the Pennsylvania State University.

Representing the Garden Spot at PSU will be the teams in Dairy food, Tractors, Flower arrangements and Entomology.

Five other teams placed in the contest, but did not receive a berth on the state team since only teams winning a blue ribbon could advance. Judges, using the Danish system of scoring gave a red ribbon to the electric demonstration squad even though it ranked first

"I see no reason why the center can not become a reality now," Smith said. Since the land represents a sizeable portion of the cost of the center.

The donation of the cash carries the stipulation that it be matched, probably by a fund raising campaign within the agricultural organizations in the county.

The next step in organization is the formulation of a board of directors to take out incorporation papers. This is being planned for the next few weeks, according to Smith.

The temporary committee handling tentative planning, along with the county agent,

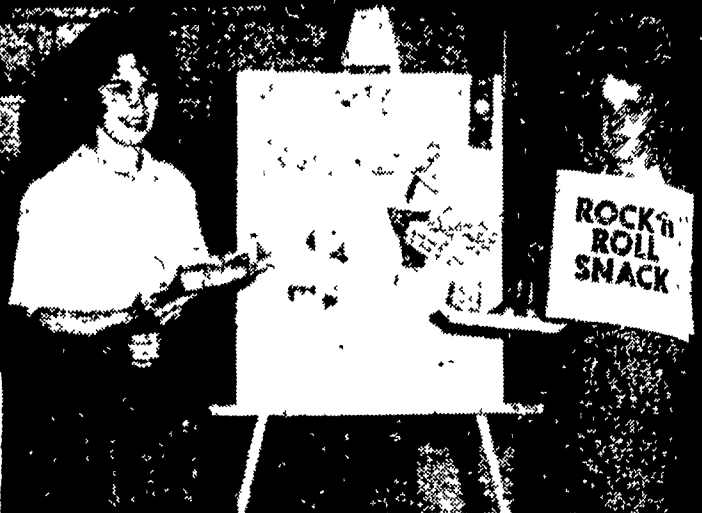

CUT FUEL BILL

Fuel consumption on farm machines can be cut an average of 15 per cent by correct adjustment and maintenance procedures, advises Burton S. Horne, Penn State extension agricultural engineer. About 75 per cent of farm machinery is out of adjustment, and unpainted, unshaded fuel storage tanks lose 3 per cent of fuel, too.
