One of the reasons given by management of the cooperative for the financial loss is the large percentage of condemnations at the plant by federal inspectors.
 In the southern states, the co-op official said, the loss due to condemnations is charged against the feeder of the birds, but all condemnation losses on birds bought at Eastern Shore (Delaware) markets, where most of the exchange's poultry was bought, must be borne by the processor.
 Cooperative officials expressed the desire to continue operation of the live bird processing, but "on a different basis" for the purchasing of the birds.

The processing plant, added as a sideline to the egg marketing program in 1944, handled 25 million pounds of poultry meat last year. The egg handling program processed and marketed over 12 million dozen last year.
