

At Lancaster Yards Market Slow and Down 50

CATTLE: 3625 compared with 2925 last week. Supply includes 50 percent slaughter steers and 40 percent stockers and feeders. Trading was slow on all classes. Compared with last week's close, slaughter steers were 25-50 lower. Cows 25-50 higher. Bulls steady. Stockers and feeders weak.

Three loads high-choice & Prime 1075-1359 lb slaughter steers sold at 27.00 and Good grade 23.50-25.50 with Standard selling at 21.00-23.50.

Cutter and Utility cows 15.25-17.50, Canners and low Cutters 13.75-15.25. Utility and Commercial bulls 19.00-22.00, Good grade fed bulls 22.00-25.00.

Medium and Good 750-1050 lb feeder steers ranged from 21.50-23.50, load 1100 lb Good also 21.50, Good to low - Choice 23.00-25.50, Common and Medium 450-600 lb stock calves 20.00-22.00.

CALVES: 650 compared with 550 last week. Trading moderately active. Vealers steady. Good and Choice vealers sold for 26.00-31.00, Choice and Prime 31.00-34.00 and several 35.00, Standard and low-Good 20.00-26.00, Utility down to 17.00.

HOGS: 1500 compared with 1600 last week. Trading slow. Barrows and gilts 25 lower than last week's close.

Sows steady. U S 1-2 190-220 lb barrows and gilts 19.20., few lots mostly No. 1 brought 20.00-20.50, 1-3 190-230 lb. butchers 18.50-19.00 with No. 3 selling at 18.25. 230-250 lb. hogs 18.00-18.50. U. S 1-3 grade 300-600 lb. sows 12.00-15.00.

SHEEP: 450 compared with 400 last week. Trading moderately active. Spring slaughter lambs steady. Good and Choice 75-95 lb. spring lambs made 20.50-22.00 and a few lots Choice and Prime sold at 22.00-23.00, few lots 60-69 lbs. made 16.50-17.00.

KEEP EGGS CLEAN

Two or 3 inches of clean dry shavings in nests in the laying house help prevent breakage and keep the eggs clean. F. H. Leuschner, Penn State extension poultry specialist, suggests frequent gathering to keep eggs clean. Wiring the droppings boards helps keep both hens and eggs clean.

Steers were fully steady going at 25.50 to 27.00. Good low choice made 23.25 to 25.00 with standard selling at 21.

The August 18 sale had receipts of 886 cattle. Compared with last week canner and cutter cows were 25-50 higher with Utility grades weak. Bulls were 25-50 higher.

Several lots of high choice and prime 900 to 1,180 pound slaughter steers commanded 27.10 to 27.50 with the bulk of the choice grades

Chicago Cattle Light Supply Slows Decline

Receipts slightly below last week and the corresponding period last year. Largest receipts in six weeks on Monday with lighter supplies the rest of the week.

Consist of receipts little changed with 70 per cent slaughter steers. Vealers and stockers and feeders very scarce.

Slaughter steers were steady to 50 lower. Vealers and stockers were steady.

A load of prime at 1,267 pounds made 28 with loads of mixed choice and prime bringing 27.75. Most lots of choice were 25.50 to 27.50 with several lots of mixed choice and prime going at 27 to 27.50. One load of prime at 1,400 pounds made 27.75.

Lots of 1,000 to 1,100 lb. yearling slaughter steers brought 26.25 to 26.50. Most average choice made 24.50 to 25.

Good and choice vealers were 22 to 25 with standard at 17 to 22. A few lots of good and mixed good and choice 850 to 900 pound feeder steers were 22.75 to 23 with a part load of choice making 24.50. Good 495 pound short yearling stocker steers made 25. Mixed good and choice 475 to 490 pound stock steers were 25.50 to 27.

Good and choice 717-925 pound heifers brought 22.50 to 24.60. Cutter and utility cows made 16 to 17 while canners and low cutters sold at 14.50 to 16. Utility and commercial bulls were 20 to 23 and good grade bulls brought 23 to 23.85.

Good and choice 654-701 pound stock steers brought 23 to 25.50, but several lots of common and medium at 510 to 787 made 18.60 to 22.35.

Calves 302. Vealers weighing less than 100 pounds were steady with heavy weights 1.00 lower. Good choice vealers made 26 to 30 with choice and prime to 30 to 36. Standard low good were 21 to 26. Utility was at 18 to 21.

Top cows were \$15 high at the August 17th sale. Dairy cattle All other kinds continued at steady prices. Receipts were 150 cows, 12 stock bulls and 12 stock heifers.

Fresh cows, Holsteins \$350-465, Guernseys — \$250, other breeds—\$200-300. Stock bulls—\$135-175. Stock heifers—\$65-140.

All kinds sold at steady prices even with the light receipts at the August 15th and pony sale. All markets continued to go to the market.

Ponies, Mares — \$110-200, geldings — \$65-130, riding horses — \$100-210, driving horses — \$100-170. Killings were 7-1/2 cents.

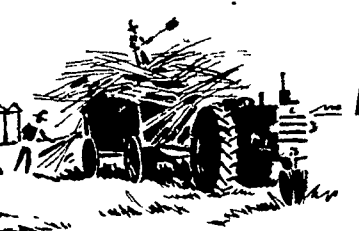
