**Best Food Buys**

**Local Vegetables Still Good**

Foodshoppers may note some influence of the rail-road strike on local produce prices this week-end, observes Tom Piper, Penn State Extension Marketing Agent.

Confused transportation and delivery schedules may interrupt normal supply patterns. Where this occurs, supplies and prices of items from distant producing areas may be temporarily affected.

Local produce production continues to provide a wide range of values at the food market. Sweetcorn, tomatoes, cucumbers, green and lima beans, peppers, eggplant and squash continue as gold market values and quality is excellent.

Katahdin and Cobbler potatoes are readily available locally. Recent weather conditions have had some adverse affect upon storage qualities.

Local harvesting of peaches is almost completed. Dwindling supplies of the Hale and Elberta varieties are available at reasonable prices. Movement of early apples is still light but McIntosh and Smoke House varieties are appearing in local markets. Supplies of Summer Rambo apples continue to hold at bargain price levels.

Little change is forecast in meat prices for this week-end. Broiler-fryers, turkeys, lamb, beef steaks, roasts and pork chops will be featured items in some area food markets.

Grade A large egg prices have leveled off at the wholesale level. The supply of small eggs continues to grow and shoppers should check the price spread to determine which size is most economical on a weight basis.
