

Lampeter, New Holland Fairs To Be Staged Next Week

Fair season swings into the third round next week with two more county exhibitions scheduled to get under way with programs Wednesday evening.

The New Holland Farmers Fair will open its 29th celebration with a parade beginning at 7 p.m. sponsored by the Young Men's Business League.

The West Lampeter Community Fair will open its celebration at 7:30 with a concert by the Lampeter-Strasburg High School band.

The feature of the New Holland Exhibition this year will be the Corn, Hay and Tobacco shows. Exhibitors can win up to \$150 for one sample of hay, up to \$55.00 for a lath of tobacco, and up to \$25.00 for 10 ears of corn. Exhibits will be accepted until 9 p.m. Tuesday evening.

Prior to the official opening of the fairs, much of the judging will have been completed. All the agriculture crop exhibits at New Holland will be judged beginning at 8:30 Wednesday morning with the FFA fat lambs scheduled to be judged at 4:00 p.m.

At Lampeter, judging of the Swine exhibits will get underway at 1:00 p.m. Wednesday with the baby beef show scheduled to follow as soon as the swine judging is completed. Most of the other agricultural and home economics exhibits will be placed on Wednesday afternoon.

A feature of the evening program at Lampeter on Wednesday is the Tractor Trouble Shooting contest in which contestants will try to get their tractors started and across the finish line.

Thursday will see the judging of swine at 1:00 p.m. followed by the beef show at New Holland. The show swine will be sold at auction at the close of judging.

Approximately 300 future Farmers of America will converge on Lampeter Community Fair Grounds on Thursday for their annual judging contest at 10:00 a.m. County dairy breed associations will

present three calves to outstanding FFA members at the conclusion of the contest. During the afternoon on Thursday, the dairy cattle will be judged.

Crowning of the Livestock Queen at 7:30 will highlight the Thursday evening program at Lampeter while a Democratic political rally

will be featured at New Holland.

The Republican political rally will climax the Friday evening program at New Holland. Friday is also Kid's day after school and a pet parade at 7:30 p.m. will top the celebration for the small fry.

Lampeter officially closes its show on Friday evening at the conclusion of a program which features an all-western horse show starting at 2:00 p.m. and resuming at 7:00 p.m. Special features will include a pig race preliminary at 3:30 and the

championship at 9:00 p.m. calf roping contest at 8:30 p.m. and the FFA fat hog consignment sale at 8:00 p.m.

New Holland's exhibition will continue through Saturday with the Baby Parade at 4:00 p.m. followed by the Farmers Fair German Band. On Saturday evening beginning at 8:00 p.m., the entertainment will be furnished by Clarence and his Country Boys.

Saturday morning has been designated by both fairs as the deadline for exhibitors to reclaim entries.

SEND SOIL SAMPLES
September and October are two of the big soil testing months. Having soil tests made early aids the farmer and the soil testing laboratory personnel, says James H. Eakin, Jr., extension agronomist at Penn State. He suggests samples be taken from sod fields to be planted to row crops next spring. Soil samples can be taken at any time during the year as long as the fertilized rows are missed. All samples must be submitted in special containers provided by the county agent.
