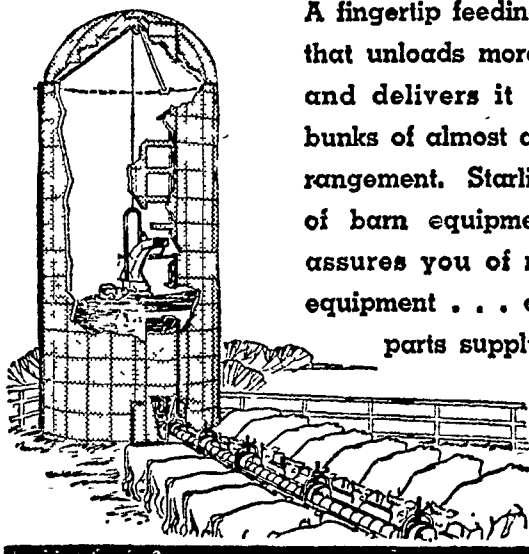

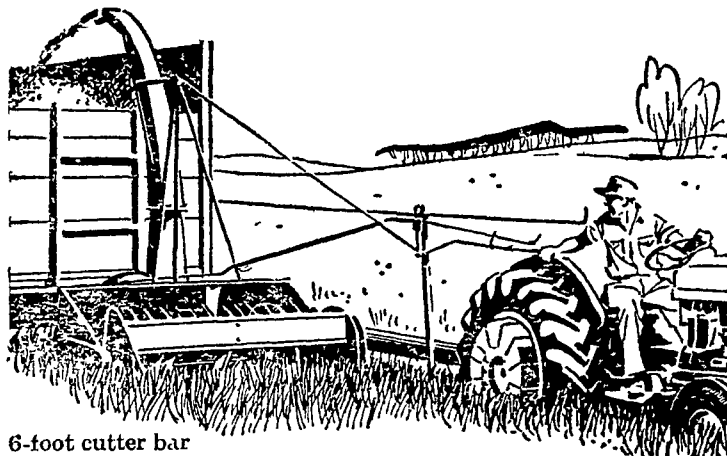

**Surplus Food Is Distributed By U.S.D.A.**

Donations of surplus foods by the U S Department of Agriculture at home and overseas totaled almost 2.8 billion pounds in the year ending June 30, 1960, down slightly from the all-time record of 3.0 billion set the previous year.

Foods donated are those acquired by USDA in its price-support and surplus-removal operations, and made available through the Agricultural Marketing Service's Direct Distribution Program to schools and charitable institutions in this country and to needy persons both here and abroad.

Foreign distribution in over 90 countries was handled by about 20 U. S. voluntary agencies in the fiscal year just ended.

Schools, under priority rules established by Congress continued to receive available stocks of butter and cheese.

More than 145 million children eating school lunches benefited from 264,400,000 pounds of surplus foods. Supplementary foods purchased by the Department exclusively for schools taking part in the National School Lunch Program are not included in these figures.
