Surplus Food Is Distributed By U.S.D.A.

Donations of surplus foods by the U S Department of Agriculture at home and overseas totaled almost 28 billion pounds in the year ending June 30, 1960, down slightly from the all-time record of 30 billion set the previous year .

Foods donated are those acquired by USDA in its price-support and surplus-removal operations, and made available through the Agricultural Marketing Service's Direct Distribution Program to schools and charitable institutions in this country and to needy persons both here and abroad


Foreign distribution in ov er 90 countries was handled by about 20 U. S voluntary agencies in the fiscal year just ended.
