The equipment used is so s.mple that almost any mechanic could adapt any farm tractor to apply the chemical at a very small cost for paris, but the time of application is so short it would probably not be profitable for a farmer to make up the equipment for his own use alone.

At the Henney farm. application was made in about one hour. The same beds last year required three days of abor by two men to do the steaming.

The entire process with the chemical takes only as long as is required to drive over the beds with the tractor.

The manufacturer recommends the plastic strip be left in place until time to seed the bed, but the work of the chemical is comp'eted in about three days. Weed seeds and insects have been well controlled in tests. Some disease control also is expected from the process, but the distributor of the chemical would make no claims as to how much disease control could be hoped for.

Henney said the cost of application of the chemical would be about equal to the cash outlay for steaming, but the labor would be less with
