

At Lancaster Yards Market Slow and Weak

CATTLE: 5750 compared with 5405 last week. Supply included 40 per cent slaughter steers and 50 per cent stockers and feeders. Trading was slow.

Compared with last week, slaughter steers were steady to 50 lower. Cows weak, spots 25 off. Utility & Commercial bulls 50 lower, Good grade bulls steady. Stockers and feeders steady.

A load Prime 1125 lb. slaughter steers sold at 27.00 lot Prime 1240 lbs. 26.50, two Prime weighing 1405 lbs. to 1480 lbs. 24.75, the bulk of the Choice 1000-1250 lb. slaughter steers 25.00-26.25; several loads 1250-1390 lbs. 24.50-25.25. Good to low choice 23.50-25.00, Standard down to 21.00.

A load of Choice heifers made 23.00. Cutter and Utility cows sold for 15.00-17.00, while Canners and low Cutters sold at 13.50-15.00. Utility and Commercial bulls ranged from 20.00-22.50, Good and Choice 800-1050 lb. feeder steers sold for 22.00-23.50 and several loads Good and Choice 1100-1150 lbs. made 21.00-22.60, Medium and Good 20-22.50. Good and Choice 600-800 lb. stock steers 23.00-25.00. Medium & Good 21.50-23.50. Few Medium & Good stock steer calves brought 23.00-25, two loads mostly Choice to Fancy 560 lbs. sold for 27-29.50.

CALVES: 600 compared with 798 last week. Trading was moderately active. Vealers steady to strong. Good & Choice vealers sold 26-31, Choice & Prime 31-5, a few sold up to 36-37. Standard & low Good 20-26, Utility

HOGS: 1650 compared with last week. Trading moderately active. Barrows & gilts fully 1.00 higher. Sows steady to strong. U.S. 1-2 190-225 lb. barrows & gilts sold at 19.00-19.50 and few lots no. 1, 195-225 lbs. made 19.50-20, U.S. 1-3 190-240 lb. butchers 18.25-18.75. 240-255 lb. butchers made 18-18.25 U.S. 1-3 mostly 2-3, 300-600 lb. sows sold at 11.00-15.00.

SHEEP: 250 compared with 429 last week. Trading moderately active. Spring slaughter lambs strong. Good and Choice 75-95 lb. spring slaughter lambs ranged from 18-19.50, few lots Choice and Prime 20-21, while a lot 88 lb Prime sold for 21.50 and Utility and low Good made 15.00-18.00.

Chicago Cattle Receipts Largest In Four Years

CATTLE: Receipts largest for any week in nearly 4 years. Prices held up well early despite heavy receipts but some classes, weights and grades broke sharply after Tuesday. Steers grading average choice and below 25-50 lower, other grades & weights generally 50-1.00 lower. Prime 1200-1395 lb. steers early 26.75-27. Early bulk choice and prime steers 24.25-26.50, Late bulk 23.50-26. Most good steers 22-23.50, 4 loads 1300-1335 lb. weights late 22.25.

Vintage Livestock Prices Are Weak On Most Kinds

CATTLE: 464, compared with last week's market, slaughter steers - at Vintage this week were steady to 25 spots 50 lower. Cows weak to 50 lower. Bulls scarce but strong.

The bulk of the choice grade 950-1250 lb. slaughter steers 25-26.25, few lots 925-1100 lb. 26.35-26.50, good to low choice 22.75-25.50, standard 21-22.75. Few good and choice 825-960 lb. heifers 20-23.10. Cutter and utility cows 15-16, canners and low cutters 13.50-15. Few utility bulls 19.60-21.25. Few lots medium and good 968-1026 lb. feeder steers 20-22.50.

CALVES: 452, Vealers weighing under 120 lb. fully 1 higher, over 120 lb. strong. Good and choice vealers 25-31, choice and prime 31-36, standard and low good 18-25, utility down to 15.

HOGS: 70, Barrows and gilts 1 higher. Few lots 1-3 198-210 lb. barrows and gilts 18.75-19, lot 1-2 grade 206 lb 19.50, small lot No. 1 193 lb 19.85.

SHEEP: 21, Not enough on sale to establish a market.

New Holland Steers Unevenly Steady

Compared with last weeks market, slaughter steers at the September 29 sale at New Holland were unevenly steady. Cows were steady to weak. Utility and commercial bulls were 50 lower, but good-grade bulls were steady. Receipts included 722 head of cattle.

Bulk of the choice grade slaughter steers made 25.25 to 26.25 with several lots of high choice 950-1,100 lb. bringing 26.35 to 26.60. Good to low choice 23 to 25.50 with standard down to 21. Good and choice 790 to

920 pound heifers brought 22.75-24.10

Cutter and utility cows made 15-16.10 while canners and low cutters were 13 to 15.25. Utility and commercial bulls brought 19.50-22.50 with good grade bulls at 22 to 24.85.

A lot of high good 871 lb. feeder steers made 24.10. Few lots of medium and good 623 to 792 lb. stock steers crossed the block at 23 to 23 and one lot of high good at 603 lbs. brought 24.10.

Calves: 371. Vealers were 1 to 2 higher on the very high quality calves in the run. Good and choice vealers were 26 to 33 with high choice and prime commanding 33 to 37. Several lots went to 37.50 to 39 and a few to 40. Low good made 18.50-26 with utility at 15.18.

Top fresh cows were steady but all other kinds were draggy and lower at the September 28 dairy cattle sale. Receipts included 172 cows, six stock bulls and 27 stock heifers.

Fresh cows, Holstein - \$460, Guernsey - \$225-250, others - \$225-300. Stock heifers - \$110-175. Stock heifers - \$65-140.

The killer market at September 26 horse sale was barely steady while all other kinds sold slow and at low prices. All mules continued to go to the killer market. Receipts included 207 head of horses, ponies and mules.

Ponies, mares - \$85-110. Geldings - \$45-110. Riding horses - \$85-175. Driving horses - \$100-275. Killers - 8 cents.

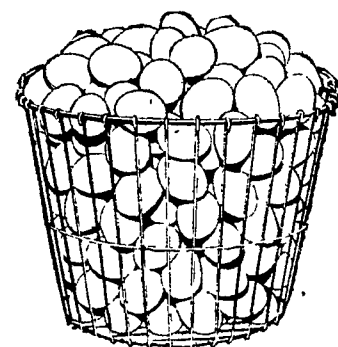
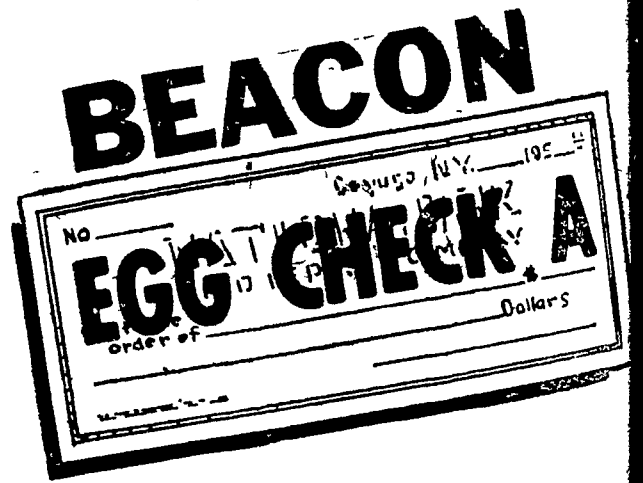

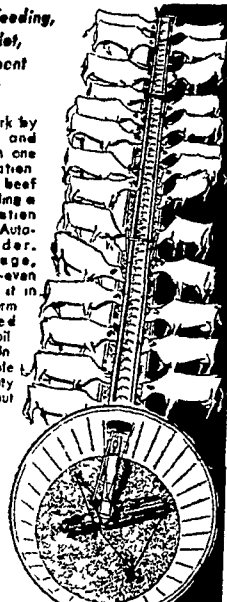
