

## At Lancaster Yards Most Kinds Show Gains

**CATTLE** 5200 compared with 5400 last week. Supply included 20 per cent slaughter steers, 70 per cent stockers and feeders. Trading was moderately active. Compared with last week's close, slaughter steers generally 25-50 higher. Cows 25 higher. Bulls steady. Stockers & feeders strong to 50 higher.

Three and a half loads of Choice and Prime 960-1255 lb. slaughter steers brought 27.00, lot Prime 1243 lbs. 26.85, load Choice 1275 lbs. 26.75. Bulk of the Choice grade slaughter steers ranged from 25.50-26.50, Good to low-Choice 23.50-25.50, Standard sold down to 21.50.

Cutter and Utility cows sold at 14.75-16.75, Canners and low-Cutters 13.25-14.75, Shells down to 11.50. Utility and Commercial bulls 18.00-21.50, few 22.00, Good grade 22.00-24.00.

Good to low-Choice 800-1050 lb. feeder steers ranged from 22.50-23.75, Medium & Good 20.00-23.00. Good and Choice 600-800 lb. stock steers were 23.00-25.50, Medium & Good 21.50-23.50. Load mostly Choice 495 lb. stock calves brought 27.75.

**CALVES:** 750 compared with 700 last week. Trading moderately active. Vealers fully steady. Good & Choice sold at 26.00-31, Choice and Prime 31.00-36, with a few 37.00, Standard & low-Good 20.00-28.00, Utility down to 16.00.

**HOGS:** 1550 compared with 1455 last week. Trading moderately active. Barrows and gilts 50-75 higher, Sows 100 higher U. S. 1-2 190-230 lb. barrows and gilts 19.75-20.50, about 60 head no. 1 190-225 lbs 20.75-21.00, lot No. 1 225 lbs. high yielding of Primal cuts 21.50, this highest since January, 1959. U. S. 1-3 190-240 lbs scored 19.00-19.75, few lot's 2.3 18.75, 240-260 lb butchers 18.50-19.00 U. S. 1, 3, mostly 2-3, 300-600 lb. sows 12.00-15.50.

**SHEEP:** 450 compared with 348 last week. Woolled slaughter lambs were fully steady. Good and Choice 75-100 lb. woolled slaughter lambs sold at 18.00-19.50 with several lots Choice and Prime bringing 20.00-21.00, and Utility and low-Good 15.00-18.00.

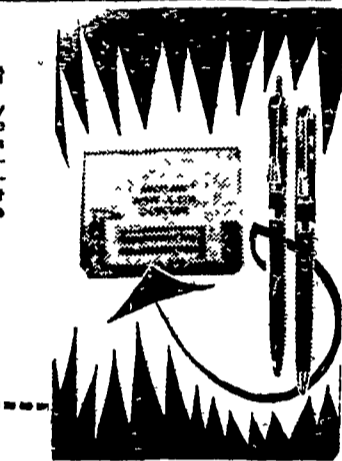

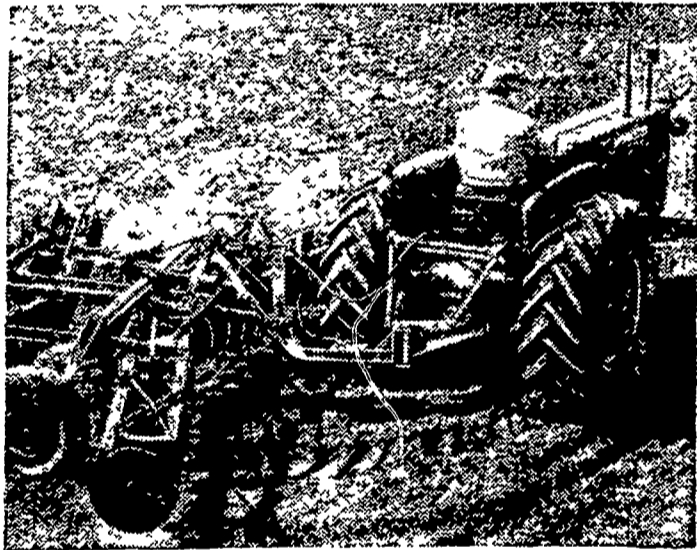

## Vintage Livestock Most Kinds Are Higher

Compared with last week's market, slaughter steers weighing under 1250 lbs. were 50-75 higher at Vintage.

Heavier wgt. steers steady to 25 higher. Cows 25 - 50 higher. Bulls 50 lower, in small supply. Receipts included 364 cattle.

Several lots mixed choice and prime 1000-1150 lb. slaughter steers 22.60-27.25, few prime 950-1250 lbs. at 27.35-27.75, the bulk of the choice slaughter steers 25.50-26.50, good to low choice 23.50-25.50, standard 21.50-23.

Few lots good and choice 900-1100 lb. heifers 22-25.60. Cutter and utility cows 15-25.16.50, canners and low-cutters 13-15.25. Utility and commercial bulls 19-21, cutters 18-19.

**CALVES:** 521. Vealers weighing under 130 lbs. 1 - 2 higher. Heavier wgt. vealers steady. Good and choice vealers 26-32, choice and prime 32-35, few 36-39, standard and low good 20-26, utility down to 17.

## New Holland Most Kinds Are Higher

Slaughter steers weighing under 1,200 pounds were 25 to 50 higher with spots 75 higher, at the October 13 auction at New Holland. Weights over 1,250 pounds were steady. Canners and cutter cows were 25 to fully 50 higher with utility grade cows and bulls steady. Receipts included 832 cattle.

Several lots of prime slaughter steers made 27.35 to 27.60. A few lots of mixed choice and prime were 26.60 to 27.25 with the bulk of the choice cattle at 25.50 to 26.50. Few lots of mixed good and choice 1,250-1,425 pounds made 24 to 25.50. Good to low choice were 23.50 to 25.75.

A few lots of choice 905 to 1,100 pound heifers sold at 23 to 24.35. Cutter and Utility cows made 15 to 16 with canners and low cutters at 13.25 to 15, and shells down to 11.35. Utility and commercial bulls 19 to 22. Cutters down to 17 with good grade bulls up to 25.25.

Several lots medium and good 576-710 pound stock steers made 22.35 to 24.10

with one lot of good 828 pound feeder steers king 21.60. Several lots medium and good 335 to pound stock steer calves 21.75 to 24.35 and one lot 411 pound good grade 25.35.

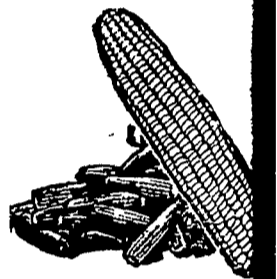
