Volume Up, Price Steady

Supplies of broilers were adequate but prices slipped slightly at the Poultry Center this week as 25 lots including 107,900 head sold at prices ranging from 16.7 to 17.7. Almost all of the sales were at 17 to 17.1. Growers were reluctant to move the birds at the lower prices and bidders got the "two sale" sign on 12 lots including 33,250 head. Four lots of 3,125 cockerel roasters made 20 to 21.8 while one lot of 500 pullet roasters brought 20.1. One lot of 300 straight run roasters sold for 21.0. Growers refused bids of 19 to 22.5 for lots of 2900 roasters. Four lots of 5,300 leghorn broilers brought 14.3 to 15.3 while five lots of 5,500 heavy broilers made 17.9 to 18.5. Two lots of 470 males crossed the block at 10.0 and 12.3. The entire October 13th sale offered 160,295 head in 42 lots and sold 123,145 head in 42 lots.

Delmarva-Georgia Slaughter Up Over Last Week

Live supplies were adequate for the needs in Delmarva la'e this week. At Farm, prices reported during the 24 hour period ending at 10:30 Friday morning ranged from 16 to 16.70 for 490,700 head.

Estimated slaughter for the week end in Delmarva is 668,000 head compared to the 452,000 head last week-end.

The De'marva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending on Oct. 7 climbed one point to 3.6. Broilers averaged 15.87 cents per pound and mash cost \$87.75 per ton. This compares to the 3.9 ratio six months ago and 3.4 for the corresponding week a year ago. During the year-ago week broilers averaged 15.18 while mash cost \$90.14 per ton.

Fluid Milk Demand Fair Supply Good

All areas reported production gain with supplies freely offered. Bottling demand was no more than fair.

Supplies above bottling requirements were liberal in most instances with surplus being readily channeled into manufacturing outlets and separators.

In many instances, stocks appeared to have little value, with the New York milkshed reporting distressed sales as low as \$5.40 to \$5.60 per 40 quart unit.
