

County Breeders Will Exhibit At Stock Show

The fourth annual Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition will draw entries from 11 Lancaster County livestock breeders and feeders.

The exposition, scheduled to be held November 7 thru 11, has become one of the major livestock events in the Eastern United States. Show officials estimate that more than 3,000 head of livestock will be shown.

Breeders from the county exhibiting at the show will include Twin Oak Farms, Mrs. Fred Frey and Sons, Quarryville R2, one market and three carcass steers; Mrs. Milton Morgan, Lancaster, seven Suffolk sheep; C. Warren Leininger, Denver, nine Spotted Poland China breeding swine and nine mar-

ket barrows; John F. Stuber, Denver, seven market barrows; Clyde Brubaker, Lancaster, one carcass wether and six carcass barrows.

Junior steer feeders entering the show and the number of entries are Darwin Boyd, Ephrata R3, six; Glen Foreman, Manheim, two; Maria Frey, Quarryville R2; Willis Hackman, Elizabethtown R3; Virginia Vivell, Columbia and Nancy Louise Rohrer, of Lititz, one each.

Four members of the 4-H horse and pony club will compete at the event on November 11. They are Barbara Shoemaker, Quarryville R2; Galen Sweigart, Denver; Paul Martin, Jr., Blue Ball and Harold Groff, Manheim R2.

No admission is charged for attendance at the livestock exposition which is held indoors in the 14 acre Pennsylvania Farm Show Buildings.


