

At Lancaster Yards Trade Active and Steady

CATTLE 5400 compared with 4835 last week. Supply includes 30 percent slaughter steers and 55 percent stockers and feeders. Trading moderately active. Compared with last week, slaughter steers were fully steady. Cows 25-50 higher. Bulls steady. Stockers and feeders 50 higher.

Two loads mostly Prime 1138-1140 lb. slaughter steers brought 27.00, four loads of high-choice and Prime 1180-1277 lbs 26.75, the bulk of the Choice grade slaughter steers sold at 25.50-26.50, lot 1007 lbs 26.65, load Choice and Prime 1467 lbs 25.00, Good to low-choice 23.50-25.50, Standard down to 21.50.

Several loads of mixed choice and prime 1,000 to 1,250 pound slaughter steers brought 26.60 to 27.10 with the bulk of the choice going at 25.50 to 26.50. Several lots 1,300 to 1,450 pound steers grading good to mostly choice made 24 to 25.50. A few good grade went at 23.50. Good to low choice under 1,250 pounds made 23.50 to 25.75 with standard selling at 21 to 23.25.

Good and choice 800 to 1,010 pound heifers made 23 to 24.50. Cutter and utility cows were 15.50 to 16.50 with cannery and low cutters at 13.75 to 15.50 and shelly down to 11.50.

Utility and commercial bulls made 20-22.25 while cutters brought 17 to 19.50 and good grade bulls made 22-25.
