

Broilers About Steady

Broiler prices at the Poultry Center this week held steady with last week's 170 head sold at prices between 16.9 and 17.2. All of the except 7 per cent lots including 1,400 silver pullets brought 12 to 17.3; one lot of 950 silver pullets made 21; one lot of 500 straight run roasters brought 17.3; one lot of pullet roasters sold for 17.3; one lot of cocker-rossers crossed the block 17.1 to 22.8.

Complete October 20 offered 116,270 head in lots and sold 98,220 head in lots. Sellers refused to sell 166 to 17.2 on three lots of broilers including 9,000 head and bids of 18 to 22 for seven lots of roasters including 10,950 head.

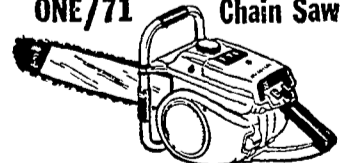
