

## Prices Slip Slightly

Prices on broilers slipped fractionally this week at the Lancaster Poultry Center and growers sold reluctant. A total of seven lots of 4,800 broilers were with-  
 brown at bids of 15.1 to 18.9  
 bids of 18 to 21.2 were re-  
 for five lots of 4,400  
 roasters.  
 Bids of 16.3 to 17.1 took  
 18 lots of broilers including  
 11,125 head. Almost half the  
 sales were between 16.8 and  
 15.9. Another 41 percent  
 sold at 17.0.  
 Seven lots of roasters  
 made 20.5 to 23 while one  
 lot of pullets brought 23.3  
 for the 1,200 head. Three  
 lots of 2,200 leghorn fowl  
 made 13 to 13.1 and four  
 lots of 4,005 heavy fowl  
 sold at 16.8 to 17.1.

## Live Prices 1/2 Cent Lower

Delmarva reported live prices averaged approxi-  
 mately 1/2 cent lower during the  
 24 hour period ending 10:30  
 Friday morning. At-farm pri-  
 ces reported during the peri-  
 od ranged from 16 to 16.80  
 on 548,000 head.

Estimated slaughter by  
 eastern shore processors for  
 the week end was 669,000  
 head compared with the 663,-  
 000 head last week end.

The Delmarva broiler-feed  
 ratio for the week ending on  
 October 21 was steady with  
 previous week at 3.8. Broilers  
 averaged 16.59 per pound  
 and mash cost \$86.72 per ton.  
 The ratio is the same as it  
 was six months ago and one  
 point higher than the same  
 week a year ago.

## Fluid Milk Offerings Off But Ample

Fluid milk production was  
 reported well maintained to  
 slightly lower. Cooler weather,  
 coupled with rather heavy  
 frost, contributed to declined  
 production in most areas.

Offerings though lighter  
 were ample for needs. Bott-  
 ling demand was only fair  
 with excess moving readily  
 into manufacturing channels  
 or separators.

Wholesale prices for bott-  
 ling quality milk in the New  
 York area was \$5.55 to \$5.60  
 per 40 quart unit.
