Most farm ponds in Pennsylvania have been constructed for fishing, swimming, and watering livestock, but N. To be useful in fighting fire the pond must be accessible by road at all seasons, and must be no closer than 75 ft. to the nearest building

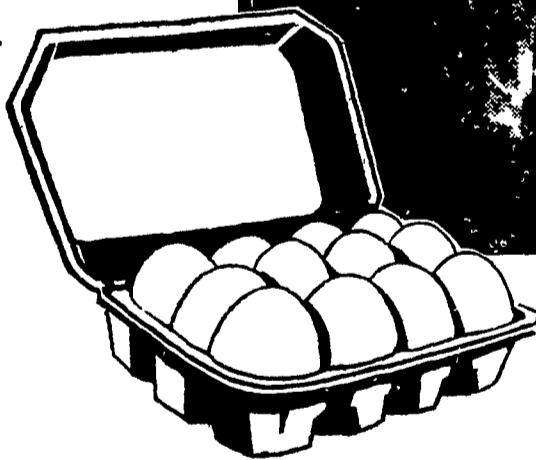

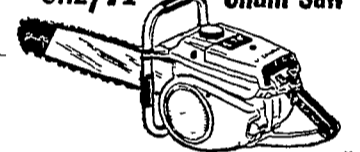
