Pa. May Be Winter Playland

HARRISBURG—Stretching across the middle of Pennsylvania's northern tier counties is a beautiful region of deep mountain forests that promises to grow into one of America's most popular vacationlands

Already familiar in summer to thousands of sight-seers who come to see the famous Pine Creek Gorge or "Grand Canyon" of Pennsylvania, and a well-known tramping ground in Pa. for Keystone State hunters, the area will soon become one of the favorite haunts of winter sports enthusiasts, if the State Department of Forests and Waters has anything to do with it.

The department will open the first state-operated ski slopes this season at Denton Hill State Park between Coudersport and Galeton on U.S. 6 in Potter County in a program to spark vacation development in northern Pennsylvania.

Located on the "roof" of Pennsylvania, the park is situated in the heart of the

state's heavy snow country - averaging 40 to 45 inches of snow a year.

Snow reports will be issued daily from the park to newspapers, radio, and television stations.

One of the brightest spots in the future of the new park—in the eyes of its planners at least—is the fact that a large adjacent tract with some of the best undeveloped slopes has been set aside for future expansion providing use of Denton Hill justifies additional expenditures Experience has already indicated that it will. Last year, although the new lodge was not completed and the snow season comparatively short, 10,000 enthusiasts used the park

Secretary of Forests and

Waters Maurice K. Goddard recently said that he views last year's comparatively heavy use as a "good omen."

Lamb Growers Urged To Keep Sales Records

Chairman Earl Groff of the Pennsylvania Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee today reminded wool growers who marketed lambs this fall of the importance of keeping adequate records of their sales. These records are needed next spring for use in applying for payments under the wool program.

"I want to urge strongly" Mr. Groff said, "that growers get these fall sales records together now and either keep them in a safe place at home or file them at the county Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation office. Applications for payments on 1960-61 marketings must be filed by the end of next April, and may be filed any time before then."

The Chairman added that lamb feeders particularly should keep accurate records on the length of time they have owned a specific lot of lambs Lamb payments are made only to producers who have owned lambs 30 days or more, and the amount of payment is based on weight gain on the lambs during the seller's ownership.

The sales record for lambs sold must include the name of the buyer, his signature, and the number of live-weight lambs sold, plus the description "unshorn." To encourage the customary practice of selling lambs with the wool on, Lamb payments are made only on lambs that have never been shorn.
