Many of the parasites of replacement heifers of vigor and general thriftiness. Internal parasites can reduce production in adult animals as well, he said.

That's the conclusion from a survey of 487 adults in a rural community, as reported by the College of Home Economics at the Pennsylvania State University.

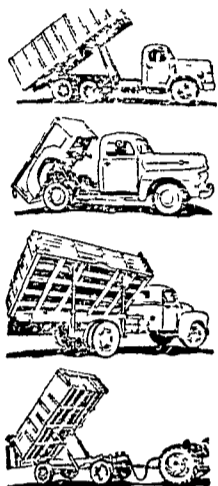
Living in a home for the

aged is looked upon most often as a second-choice arrangement, says Joseph H. Britton, professor of child development and family relations at Penn State.

'Older people have a strong feeling for self-sufficiency and independence, as shown by the interviews,' Dr Britton points out. 'Nearly half of the people interviewed believed a person should work as long as he is physically able. More women than men are against retirement,' he adds.

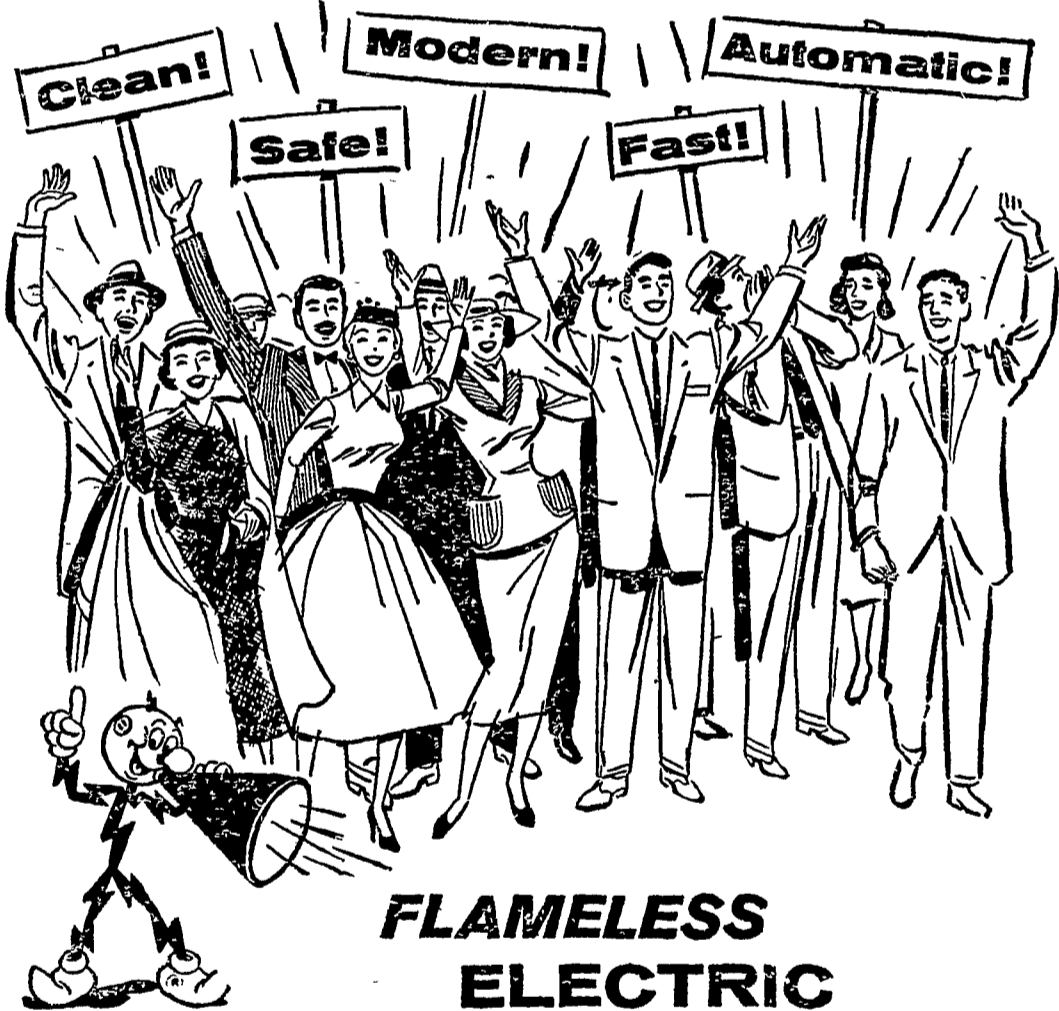

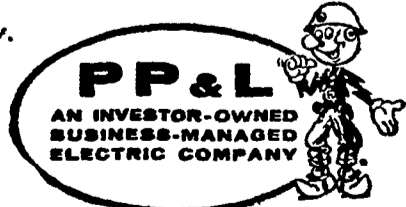

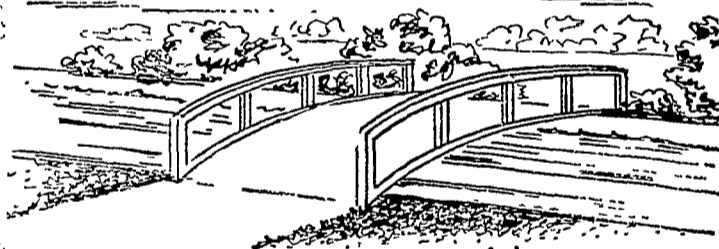
