

## CD Maps Plans for Meetings

Associate directors, meet with the directors, of Lancaster County Soil Conservation District Monday night drew up plans for campaign to add new co-

operators during the fall and winter season.

Directors approved conservation plans for seven new cooperators at the meeting, bringing the total for the year to 124. For the same period last year, 100 new plans had been approved.

The thirty associate directors and cooperating agency representatives heard chairman Amos Funk urge the members to contact as many neighbors as possible and have them sign agreements privately Funk said that the district directors were ready to cooperate with any associate director who felt a watershed meeting in his area would further the cause of conservation in the country.

John Kitch, service forester reminded the group that forest tree seedlings have been made available to any cooperator who will pay the transportation charges from the state nursery. A York

County pulp wood company will pay the \$6 00 per thousand cost of the seedlings for any trees planted on farms of SCD cooperators. Transportation charges are \$1 00 per thousand trees, but if the farmer will pick the trees up at the nursery, the pulp company will pay all charges.

In other business, the directors approved the site of the annual banquet scheduled to be held during the first week of March. The meal will be served at the Ephrata Evangelical United

Brethren Church.

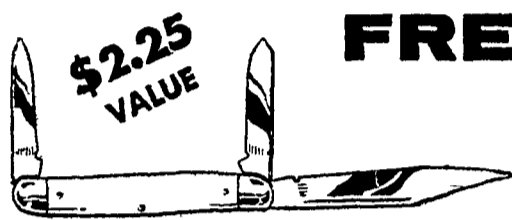

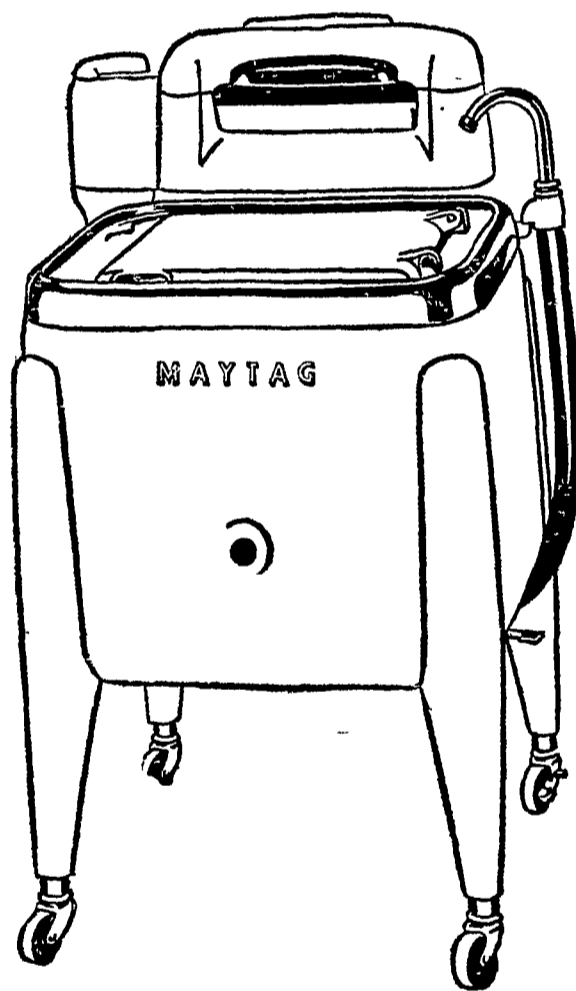
