

The Metropolitan Cooperative Milk Producers Bargaining Agency will conduct its unique grass roots Leadership and Information roots Program for Lancaster county and area dairymen on November 28 through Detember 1 at Mount Joy.

The p ogram, will feature outstanding milk marketing experts, cooperative leaders and educators.

All area dairymen are invited to attend. Meals will be furnished.

Daily sessions will run from 10 am. to 4 pm.

The program is aimed at giving dairymen a better understanding of milk orders, laws, regulations, organizations and state and federal units which affect the conduct of their business. More than 2000 have attended these sessions since the school started in 1956.

Such topics as New York State Milk Control, Mational Sanitation Code, Role of Government in Business. Order 27, Bulk Tanks, Coopera tive Organization and many others will be taken up
