alfalfa, cover, pasture, winter oats, and lawns—1½ to 2 quarts dinitro (Sinox P.E., Dow Pre-emerge) in 50 or more gallons of water—bright sunny days—temperature 50 - 60 degrees.

Chickweed: Old stands of alfalfa, asparagus beds, strawberries, — 1 quart of Chloro I.P.C. in 30 - 40 gallons of water, Nov. 15 to Jan. 15. If Downy Broome is a problem, increase the rate to two quarts per acre.

Ground Ivy: Asparagus, strawberry beds and poultry ranges—2 quarts dinitro (Sinox P.E., Dow Pre-emerge) in 40 - 50 gallons of water—bright sunny days, temperature 50 - 60 degrees.

"After applying spray, wash the sprayer, hose and nozzle with hot water to which 1 to 2 cups of detergent or soap powder has been added, then rinse with clean water. Drain pump, valves, hose and nozzle to prevent freezing. M.C.P. is a 2-4 D derivative, so to clean sprayer you will need to use the 24 hour boiling water soak with Household Ammonia or Tri-sodium Phosphate, the same as you would for 2-4-D". Sloat said.

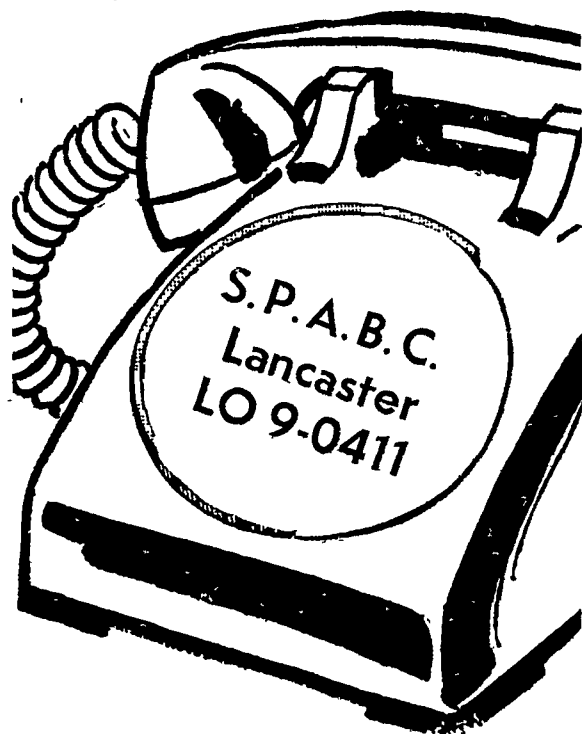
